#### PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF NOVA SCOTIA, 1928

The following preliminary report on the fisheries of Nova Scotia is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

#### PRODUCTION

The product of the fisheries of Nova Scotia in 1928 had a total value of \$11,570,387, compared with \$10,783,631 in 1927. These figures represent the value of the fish marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured or otherwise prepared. The value for 1928 exceeds that of the preceding year by \$786,756, or 7 p.c., and exceeds that of the average of the ten-year period, 1919 to 1928, by \$550,205, or 5 p.c. The cod fishery is of chief importance in the province, with a value in 1928 of \$4,406,507. This is an increase over the preceding year of \$950,735, or  $27\frac{1}{2}$  p.c. The lobster fishery is next in importance with a product in 1928 valued at \$3,048,255, a decrease from the preceding year of \$207,372. Haddock is third on the list with a product valued at \$1,654,977, an increase of \$252,842. Other kinds of fish with a product of upwards of \$100,000 in 1928 are mackerel, herring, halibut, hake and cusk, scallops, salmon, swordfish and smelts. The most important item of production in the cod fishery is dried cod, which amounted in 1928 to 285,926 cwt., valued at \$2,250,845. Haddock is marketed chiefly as fresh, fresh fillets and smoked, while in the lobster fishery the items of "marketed in shell" and "canned" are about equal, the former having in 1928 a value of \$1,525,674 and the latter a value of \$1,465,239. Statistics of quantity and value of fish caught and the forms in which marketed are given in table 1; the quantity caught and the total value marketed of the chief commercial fishes, 1925 to 1928, in table 2; and the total value of the fisheries of the province for the years 1919 to 1928, in table 2.

#### CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

#### PRIMARY OPERATIONS:

Capital.— The amount of capital represented by the vessels, boats, gear, etc., employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish in 1928 was \$7,355,052, a decrease of \$807,008 from the preceding year. The principal decreases are in the number and value of steam vessels, which dropped from 14, valued at \$1,060,000 in 1927 to 10. valued at \$680,000 in 1928, and in the number and value of sailing and gasoline vessels, which dropped from 385, valued at \$1,839,544 in 1927 to 370, valued at \$1,405,301 in 1928.

Employees.—The number of men employed in the primary operations in 1928 was 15,888, a decrease of 243 from the preceding year.

FISH CANNING AND CURING ESTABLISHMENTS:

Capital. The capital investment of the fish canning and curing establishments amounted in 1928 to \$3,787,597, compared with \$3,306,389 in 1927. There were 112 lobster canneries, 8 clam canneries, 3 other fish canneries, 88 fish curing establishments, and 3 reduction plants in operation in 1928, a total of 219 establishments, compared with a total of 225 establishments in 1927.

Employees. - The establishments gave employment in 1928 to 3,710 persons, compared with a total of 3,616 in 1927. The salaries and wages paid amounted to \$1,201,402 in 1928, compared with \$1,078,804 in 1927.
