

ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF ONTARIO, THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES AND THE YUKON TERRITORY, 1941

The present bulletin, containing advance reports of the fisheries of Ontario, the Prairie Provinces and the Yukon Territory, for the year 1941, is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, in co-operation with the Dominion Fisheries Department and the Fisheries Departments of the provinces concerned.

ONTARIO

Production. - The product of the Ontario fisheries in 1941 had a marketed value of \$3,518,402, an increase over the preceding year of \$483,302, or 16 per cent. The fishery of first importance is that of the whitefish: the marketed value of output of this fishery in 1941 was \$1,337,679, or 38 per cent of the total for all kinds. Trout and pickerel are second and third respectively in order of value of product. All three kinds record increases over 1940 in total value.

The total quantity of fish taken by Ontario fishermen, for commercial purposes, during the year was 269,466 cwt., with a value at the point of landing of \$3,031,247, compared with a catch of 279,620 cwt. and a landed value of \$2,560,362 in 1940. The catches of whitefish, trout and herring were larger than in 1940, but decreases are recorded for pickerel, perch, blue pickerel and tullibee. The average price per cwt. received by the fishermen for each of the four principal kinds of fish were: whitefish, \$18.60, compared with \$13.90 in 1940; trout, \$16.40, compared with \$13.60; pickerel, \$12.00, compared with \$10.40; and perch, \$10.50, compared with \$6.90.

Capital Equipment and Employees. - The capital investment of the fisheries of Ontario in 1941, as represented by the boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., had a value of \$3,260,441, compared with \$3,217,462 in the preceding year. The tugs, boats, skiffs and canoes had a combined value of \$1,283,325, and the gill nets a value of \$1,040,912, the amount of these items representing 71 per cent of the total capital investment.

The number of men engaged in fishing operations in the province during the year was 5,608, a reduction of 412 from the preceding year.

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES

<u>Production</u>. - The total value of production of the fisheries of the three Prairie provinces in 1941, as marketed, was \$4,088,051, distributed by provinces as follows: Manitoba, \$3,233,115; Saskatchewan, \$414,492; and Alberta, \$440,444. Compared with the preceding year the output of Manitoba shows an increase of \$1,244,570, or 63 per cent; that of Saskatchewan, an increase of \$10,982, or 3 per cent; and that of Alberta a reduction of \$10,130, or 2 per cent.

The principal kinds, in order of value, for the three provinces as a whole, are: whitefish (\$1,144,322); saugers (\$1,038,470); and pickerel (\$931,409). The sauger is taken commercially only in Manitoba, and in 1941 it was the most important fishery in that province. In Saskatchewan and in Alberta the whitefish is the most valuable of the chief commercial fishes.

The total quantity of fish of all kinds taken by fishermen of the Prairie provinces was 564,199 cwt. with a value at the point of landing of \$2,907,053, compared with a catch of 451,795 cwt. and a landed value of \$2,003,975 in 1940. The total for 1941 is divided by provinces as follows: Manitoba, a catch of 417,202 cwt. and a landed value of \$2,448,228; Saskatchewan, a catch of 78,445 and a landed value of \$261,490; and Alberta a catch of 68,552 cwt. and a landed value of \$197,335. In Manitoba and in Saskatchewan practically all the principal kinds of fish show increases in catch, but in Alberta the two principal fisheries — whitefish and tullibee — record reduced output.

Capital Equipment and Employees. - The capital investment of the fisheries of the three provinces, as represented by the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., in 1941, had a total value of \$1,958,899, compared with \$1,611,890 in the preceding year. By provinces, the figures for 1941 and 1940 (those for 1940 in brackets) are: Manitoba, \$1,503,242;(\$1,149,546); Saskatchewan, \$1.36,392 (\$145,211); and Alberta, \$319,265 (\$317,133).

The number of fishermen employed during the year was 10,217, distributed by provinces as follows: Manitoba, 6,618; Saskatchewan, 1,305; and Alberta, 2,294. The total for the three provinces in 1940 was 8,165.

THE YUKON TERRITORY

The fisheries of the Yukon Territory are of small importance commercially: in 1941 the total catch was only 526 cwt. The fish is marketed locally by the fishermen and the total value is recorded as \$6,652. Comparative figures for 1940 are: catch, 327 cwt., and value, \$4,994. The value of the boats and gear used in fishing operations was \$5,291, compared with \$5,044 in 1940, and the number of fishermen was 30, compared with 29.
