ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF ONTARIO, THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES AND THE YUKON TERRITORY, 1942

This bulletin containing advance reports of the fisheries of Ontario, the Prairie Provinces and the Yukon Territory, for the year 1942 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, in co-operation with the Dominion Fisheries Department and the Fisheries Departments of the provinces concerned.

ONTARIO

Production. - The product of the Ontario fisheries in 1942 had a marketed value of \$4,103,345, an increase over the preceding year of \$584,943 or 17 per cent. The fishery of first importance is that of the whitefish; the marketed value of this fishery in 1942 was \$1,510,763 or 37 per cent of the total for all kinds. Trout and blue pickerel are second and third respectively in order of value of product. All three kinds show increases in value over 1941.

The total quantity of fish taken was 263,780 cwt. with a value at the point of landing of \$3,545,888, compared with a catch of 269,466 cwt. and a landed value of \$3,031,247 in 1941. The catches of blue pickerel and pike were larger but decreases are shown for all other kinds landed. The average price per cwt. received by the fishermen for each of the three principal kinds of fish was: - whitefish \$24.90 compared with \$18.60 in 1941; trout \$20.01 compared with \$16.40 and blue pickerel \$11.20 compared with \$10.40.

<u>Capital Equipment and Employees</u>. - The capital investment of the fisheries of Ontario in 1942, as represented by the boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc. had a value of \$3,100,806, compared with \$3,260.441 in the preceding year. The tugs, boats, skiffs and canoes had a combined value of \$1,262,474 and the gill nets a value of \$930,944 the amount of these items representing almost 71 per cent of the total capital invested.

The number of men engaged in fishing operations in the province during the vear was 3,336. a reduction of 272 from the preceding year.

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES

<u>Production</u>. - The total value of production of the fisheries of the three Prairie provinces in 1942, as marketed, was \$4,655,580, distributed by provinces as follows: Manitoba, \$3,577,616, Saskatchewan, \$585,782 and Alberta \$492,182. Compared with the preceding year the output of Manitoba shows an increase of \$344,501 or 11 per cent, that of Saskatchewan an increase of \$171,290 or 41 per cent and that of Alberta \$51,738 or 12 per cent.

The principal kinds in order of value for the three provinces combined are whitefish (\$1,532,752); saugers (\$1,238,500) and pickerel (\$1,074,354). The sauger is taken commercially in Manitoba only and was the first in order of value for the province in 1942. In Saskatchewan and in Alberta, the whitefish is the most valuable of the chief commercial fishes.

The total quantity of fish of all kinds taken by fishermen of the Prairie provinces was 503,005 cwt. with a value at the point of landing of \$2,323,347, compared with a catch of 564,199 cwt. and a landed value of \$2,907,053 in 1941. The total for 1942 is divided by provinces as follows: - Manitoba, a catch of 359,353 cwt. and a landed value of \$2,727,050; Saskatchewan, a catch of 81,802 cwt., valued at \$383,531 and Alberta, a catch of 61,850 cwt., valued at \$212,766. In Manitoba the four principal kinds of fish, saugers, pickerel, whitefish and tullibee show decreases in catch but increases in both values landed and marketed. In Saskatchewan, whitefish and pickerel show increases both in quantities of catch and values landed and marketed. In Alberta, whitefish shows a decrease in catch but an increase in values landed and marketed. Both tullibee and pickerel show increases in catch as well as values landed and marketed.

Capital Equipment and Employees. - The capital investment of the fisheries of the three provinces, as represented by the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc. in 1942, had a total value of \$2,145,202 compared with \$1,981,272 in the preceding year. By provinces the figures for 1942 are: Manitoba \$1,666,834; Saskatchewan \$184,083 and Alberta \$294,285.

The number of fishermen employed in the three Prairie provinces for 1942 was 9,035; Manitoba, 5,557; Saskatchewan, 1,581; and Alberta 1,897. This shows a decrease of 1,200 from 1941.

THE YUKON TERRITORY

The catch of fish in the Yukon Territory for 1942 was 287 cwt. valued at \$3,056 compared with a catch of 526 cwt. valued at \$6,652 in 1941. The value of the boats and gear was \$5,584 in 1942 compared with \$5,291 in 1941. The number of fishermen was 31, an increase of 1 over 1941.
