ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF ONTARIO, THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES AND
THE YUKON TERRITORY, 1943

This Bulletin is issued in co-operation with the Dominion Fisheries Department and the Fisheries Departments of the provinces concerned.

ONTARIO FISHERIES

Production. - The value of the production of the fisheries of Ontario reached a new peak in 1943, being recorded at \$5,292,268 as compared with \$4,135,205 in 1942, an increase of \$1,157,063 or 28 p.c. The increase was due to both larger quantities and higher prices, the catch increasing by 16 p.c.

Blue pickerel was the most important variety caught, having increased by 118 p.c. in quantity and 147 p.c. in value over 1942. Whitefish, on the other hand, declined by 23 p.c. in quantity and 15 p.c. in value. The other five varieties with a value of \$100,000 or over are shown in Table 2.

The quantity of fish landed amounted to 305,932 cwt., an increase of 42,-152 cwt. or 16 p.c. over the 1942 catch.

Seven varieties of fish showed increases in the quantity caught, while six showed decreases from the preceding year.

Capital, Equipment and Employees. - The capital invested amounted to \$3,... 387,474, an increase of \$286,668 or 9 p.c. over 1942. The tugs, boats, skiffs and canoes had a combined value of \$1,380,901 or 41 per cent of the whole, the remainder (\$2,006,573) being the value of nets, piers and wharves and freezers or ice houses.

The number of men engaged in the fisheries in 1943 was 3,610, an increase of 274 over 1942.

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES

Production. - The total value of production of the fisheries of the three Prairie Provinces in 1943, as marketed, was \$6,514,095, distributed by provinces as follows: Manitoba, \$4,564,551; Saskatchewan, \$1,154,544; and Alberta, \$795,000. Higher prices were the main factor in the increased value, although there was an intensification of fishing in Saskatchewan. As compared with 1942 the catch in Manitoba decreased by 0.2 p.c. in quantity and the value increased by 28 p.c. In Saskatchewan, the quantity landed increased by 28 p.c. and the value by 97 p.c. and in Alberta the increases were 7 p.c. and 62 p.c., respectively.

The principal kinds in order of value for the three provinces combined were: whitefish (\$2,282,119); pickerel (\$1,636,793); and saugers (\$1,056,374). The sauger is taken commercially in Manitoba only and was second in order of value for the province in 1943. In Saskatchewan and in Alberta, the whitefish is the most valuable of the commercial fishes.

The total quantity of fish of all kinds taken by fishermen of the Prairie Provinces was 529,943 cwt. with a value at the point of landing of \$4,594,022, compared with a catch of 503,005 cwt. and a landed value of \$3,323,347 in 1942. The total for 1943 is divided by provinces as follows: Manitoba, a catch of 358,646 cwt. and a landed value of \$3,427,614; Saskatchewan, a catch of 104,866 cwt., valued at \$773,181; and Alberta, a catch of 66,431 cwt., valued at \$393,227. In Manitoba, whitefish, pickerel and tullibees showed increases in catch and saugers a decrease but landed values were higher in the case of all four varieties. In Saskatchewan, whitefish and trout showed increases in both catch and landed value, while pickerel showed a decrease in catch but an increase in landed value. In Alberta, whitefish and pickerel increased in catch and value but tullibees registered a small decrease in catch but an increase in value.

Capital Equipment and Employees. - The capital investment of the fisheries of the three provinces, as represented by the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc. in 1943, had a total value of \$2,509,996 compared with \$2,145,202 in the preceding year. By provinces, the figures for 1943 are:
Manitoba, \$1,892,825; Saskatchewan, \$250,277 and Alberta, \$366,894. On a percentage basis, Saskatchewan registered the greatest increase in capital with 36 p.c.

The number of fishermen employed in the three Prairie Provinces for 1943 was 9,035; Manitoba, 6,185; Saskatchewan, 1,919; and Alberta, 2,398, or an over-all increase of 1,467.

THE YUKON TERRITORY

The catch of fish in the Yukon Territory for 1943 was 159 cwt. valued at \$2,495 compared with a catch of 283 cwt. valued at \$3,056 in 1942. The value of the boats and gear was \$4,840 in 1943 compared with \$5,584 in 1942. The number of fishermen was 34, an increase of 3 over 1942.
