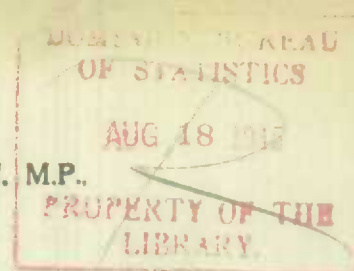

ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF ONTARIO, THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES AND YUKON,
1944

This Bulletin is issued in co-operation with the Dominion Fisheries Department and the Fisheries Departments of the provinces concerned.

ONTARIO FISHERIES

Production. - The production of the fisheries of Ontario in 1944 was valued at \$4,938,193, a decrease of \$354,075, or 6.7 p.c., as compared with 1943. Lower prices offset a slight increase in the quantity of fish landed.

Whitefish regained first place in order of value, amounting to \$1,352,071, an increase of 5.4 p.c. over 1943. Blue pickerel fell to second place with a marketed value of \$954,509, a decrease of 31.4 p.c. from the 1943 figure. Trout, pickerel (dore), lake herring, perch and tullibee all registered values of \$100,000 or over, as shown in Table 2.

The quantity of fish landed was 310,392 cwt., an increase of 1.5 p.c. over the 1943 landings of 305,932 cwt. Seven varieties of fish showed increases in the quantity caught, while six showed decreases from the preceding year.

Capital, Equipment and Employment. - The capital invested amounted to \$3,620,805, an increase of \$233,331, or 6.9 p.c., over 1943. Vessels and boats were valued at \$1,534,821, or 42.4 p.c. of the whole, the remainder (\$2,085,984) being the value of nets, lines and land equipment.

The number of men engaged in the fisheries in 1944 was 3,809, an increase of 199 over 1943.

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES

Production. - The total marketed value of the fisheries production of the three Prairie Provinces in 1944 registered a decrease of 8.7 p.c. as compared with 1943, the value being \$5,993,905 against \$6,514,095. By provinces, the marketed values were; Manitoba, \$3,581,795; Saskatchewan, \$1,482,223; Alberta, \$929,887. Manitoba recorded a decrease of \$982,756 while Saskatchewan and Alberta showed increases of \$327,679 and \$134,887, respectively. Smaller catches of saugers and whitefish in Manitoba were a contributory factor to the overall decrease.

Whitefish, pickerel and saugers led in value. The latter fish is taken commercially in Manitoba only, where it ranks second to pickerel in value. In the other two provinces, whitefish is the leading variety. The total quantity of fish landed in the three provinces was 499,157 cwt. valued at \$4,326,919. In 1943 the quantity was 529,943 cwt. valued at \$4,594,022. By provinces, the landings and values to fishermen were; Manitoba, 293,231 cwt., \$2,830,060; Saskatchewan, 129,588 cwt., \$1,032,061; Alberta, 76,338 cwt., \$464,798. Manitoba recorded a decrease of 18.2 p.c. in quantities landed and of 17.4 p.c. in landed values; Saskatchewan showed increases of 23.5 p.c. and 33.5 p.c., respectively and Alberta increases of 14.9 p.c. and 18.7 p.c.

Capital, Equipment and Employment. - The capital investment in the fisheries of the three provinces amounted to \$2,743,923, an increase of 9.1 p.c. Saskatchewan again recorded the greatest percentage increase, the gain over 1943 being 65.9 p.c.

Employment in the fisheries increased in Saskatchewan and Alberta, but Manitoba recorded a small decrease. The total number of men so engaged in the three provinces was 12,574, an increase of 2,072, or 39.2 p.c. over 1943.

YUKON

The production of Yukon was valued at \$3,131 as compared with \$2,495 in 1943. The catch was 281 cwt. as compared with 159 cwt. in 1943. The value of boats showed an increase, but nets and fish wheels registered losses. Employment was afforded to 38 men, as against 34 in 1943.

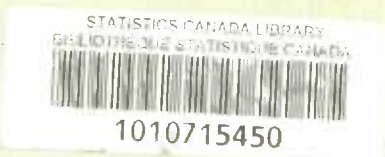
