ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF ONTARIO, THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES AND
THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES, 1948

This Bulletin is issued in co-operation with the Dominion Fisheries Department and the Fisheries Departments of the provinces concerned. No figures are available for the 1948 fishery in the Yukon Territory.

ONTARIO FISHERIES

The fisheries for the province of Ontario in 1948 yielded \$6,393,655, an increase of \$989,973 or 18 p.c. over the 1947 figure.

Whitefish was first in order of value amounting to \$2,251,578 or 35 p.c. of the total value for the province and an increase of 56 p.c. over the 1947 figure, due largely to a greater catch.

Blue pickerel came second with a marketed value of \$990,536 or 154 p.c. over the previous year; this increase, however, represented the net effect of a substantially lower average price, realized on a catch more than three times that of 1947.

Pickerel or dore (yellow pike) was third in marketed value, yielding \$816,501 or 8 p.c. over the 1947 figure, followed by trout with \$770,854, an 18 p.c. rise.

The quantity landed was 291,013 cwt., an increase of 41,819 cwt. or 17 p.c. over the previous year.

The capital investment was \$5,716,075, an increase of \$569,046 or 11 p.c. Vessels and boats were valued at \$2,492,302 or 44 p.c. of the total figure, and nets and other gear and equipment at \$3,223,773.

The number employed in the fisheries was 3,736 men, 290 less than in 1947.

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES

The statistics of the Prairie Provinces cover the summer fishery of 1948 and the winter fishery of 1948-49.

Marketed values were: Manitoba \$5,414,583; Saskatchewan, \$1,282,437; Alberta, \$636,352; a total of \$7,333,372, or .3 p.c. less than the 1947 total. Manitoba and Saskatchewan showed increases of 1.6 p.c. and 9.5 p.c. respectively, while Alberta registered a decline of 25.7 p.c.

Pickerel led in value overall, accounting for nearly half the total in Manitoba and holding third place in Saskatchewan and fourth in Alberta; whitefish led in Saskatchewan and Alberta, taking second place in Manitoba and overall; saugers were important in Manitoba, tullibee and pike in Manitoba and Alberta, and trout in Saskatchewan.

Quantities landed and values to fishermen, with percentage increase or decrease on 1947 figures given in brackets, were: Manitoba, 315,287 cwt. (+ 5 p.c.) and \$3,181,300 (- 8 p.c.); Saskatchewan, 80,756 cwt. (+ .7 p.c.) and \$512,600 (+ 6 p.c.); Alberta, 72,236 cwt. (- 27 p.c.) and \$375,000 (- 16 p.c.); totals, 468,279 cwt. (- 2 p.c.) and \$4,068,900 (- 8 p.c.).

The value of equipment used in the primary fisheries of the three provinces was reported as \$3,377,355, of which Manitoba accounted for 72.3 p.c. The number of men employed was 11,729, a decrease in Saskatchewan, compared with 1947, of 289 being offset by increases totalling 288 in the other two provinces.

NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

The commercial catch was 78,050 cwt., with a value to fishermen of \$377,100 and marketed value of \$1,527,800 - increases of 124 p.c., 172 p.c. and 188 p.c., respectively, over the 1947 figures. The capital investment was \$292,970 as compared with \$167,164 in the previous year. The summer fishery at Great Slave Lake employed 99 men, and the winter fishery 301.
