ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF ONTARIO, THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES AND
THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES, 1949

This bulletin is issued in co-operation with the Dominion Department of Fisheries and the Fisheries Departments of the provinces concerned. No figures are available for the 1949 fishery in the Yukon Territory.

ONTARIO FISHERIES

In 1949 the fisheries of the Province of Ontario yielded \$5,728,000, a decrease of \$666,000 or 10.4 p.c. from the total for 1948.

Whitefish was first in order of value at \$2,224,000, or 38.8 p.c. of the total value for the province. This amount, however, was 1.2 p.c. below that for the previous year.

Pickerel (dore) came second with a marketed value of \$665,000, 18.6 p.c. below the 1948 level.

Blue pickerel dropped to third place with a value of \$662,000, 32.2 p.c. lower than last year, despite the fact that the catch was much greater in volume.

The quantity landed was 33,407,000 lb., 4,306,000 lb. or 14.8 p.c. higher than in 1948.

The value of the equipment used in the fisheries was \$5,903,688, an increase of \$187,613 or 3.3 p.c. This year vessels and boats were valued at \$2,518,331, or 42.5 p.c. of the total figure, and nets and other gear and equipment at \$3,385,357.

3,930 persons were employed in the fisheries in 1949, 194 more than in 1948.

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES

The statistics of the Prairie Provinces cover the summer fishery of 1949 and the winter fishery of 1949-50.

Marketed values were: Manitoba \$4,800,400; Saskatchewan \$1,025,900; Alberta \$652,500; a total of \$6,478,800, or 11.5 p.c. less than the 1948 total. Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta showed decreases of 11.3, 20.0 and 2.6 p.c., respectively.

Whitefish led in value overall, holding second place in Manitoba, and first in both Saskatchewan and Alberta. The pickerel fishery was the most valuable in Manitoba, but was only third in Saskatchewan and fourth in Alberta. Saugers were important in Manitoba, pike and tullibee in Manitoba and Alberta.

Quantities landed and values to fishermen -- with percentage increase or decrease from 1948 figures in brackets -- were: Manitoba 29,503,000 lb. (- 6.4 p.c.) and \$2,820,600 (- 11.3 p.c.); Saskatchewan 7,473,000 lb. (- 7.5 p.c.) and \$520,800 (+ 1.6 p.c.); Alberta 6,287,000 lb. (- 12.9 p.c.) and \$377,100 (+ 0.6 p.c.); total, 43,263,000 lb. (- 6.8 p.c.) and \$3,718,500 (- 8.6 p.c.).

The value of equipment used in the primary fisheries of the three provinces was reported as \$2,704,300, of which Manitoba accounted for 75.6 p.c. The number of men employed was 9,936, a decrease of 1,793 spread over all three provinces.

NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

The commercial catch was 7,519,000 lb., with a value to fishermen of \$586,000 and marketed value of \$2,334,000 - a decrease of 3.7 p.c., and increases of 34 p.c. and 53 p.c., respectively, over the 1948 figures. The capital investment was \$598,887 as compared with \$292,970 in the previous year.
