Fisheries of Prince Edward Island, 1921.

Returns of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island for the year 1921 have been compiled and the following statement is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Marine and Fisheries. The value of the fisheries production is shown to have been \$924,529, a decrease from the previous year of \$784,194 or 45 per cent. The decrease shown in total value is the result principally of lower prices for all products of the fisheries, but is also due in part to the smaller pack of lobsters. In 1921 there were 31,155 cases of lobsters valued at \$634,744, while in the preceding year the pack was 40,322 cases valued at \$1,381,474. The average values of canned lobsters were \$20 in 1921 and \$34 in 1920. The following table shows for Prince Edward Island the quantities and values of the chief commercial fishes, caught and landed, and of the forms in which marketed, for the years 1920 and 1921.

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Capital and Employees in the Fisheries Industry of Prince Edward Island.

(1) Primary Operations -

Capital: The amount of capital represented in the vessels, boats, nots, traps, piers and wharves, etc., engaged in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, was \$675,750 in 1921, compared with \$921,350 in the previous year.

Employees: The number of employees engaged in these operations was 2,075 in 1921, compared with 2,793 in the previous year.

(2) Fish Canning and Curing Establishments -

Capital: The amount of capital represented in fish canning and curing establishments in 1921 was \$295,048, compared with \$387,829 in 1920.

Employees: The number of persons wmpleyed in fish canning and curing establishments was 1,550 in 1921, and 2,000 in 1920.
