

THE FISHEPIES OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1924

The following preliminary statement of the fisheries of

Prince Edward Island is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in

co-operation with the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

Production

The total marketed value of the project of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1934 was #1,201,772. This is a decrease from the preceding year of #553,202. The decrease shown is due chiefly to the smaller lobster pack, which comprised 26,814 cases, valued at #681,575 in 1924, compared with 43,831 cases, valued at #1,278,945 in 1923. The quantity of the catch of lobsters was 65,893 cwt., compared with 97,456 cwt. in the preceding year. Increases are shown in the catch of cod, hake and cusk, mackerel, smelts, clams and quahaugs, and cysters, and decreases in the catch of herring and haddook. The value of the total catch of fish at the vessel's or boat's side was #829,171, compared with \$1,105,801 in 1923.

Capital Equipment and Employees

Primary Operations. The amount of capital represented in the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., engaged in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish was #332,928, compared with #983,223 in 1923. The number of men employed in these operations in 1924 was 3,537, compared with 2,503 in 1923.

Fish Canning and Curing Estaclishments.— The lobster canneries in operation in 1924 numbered 1.5, a decrease of 50 from the preceding year. Three clam canneries and one fish curing establishment operated in both years. The total amount of capital invested in the establishments in 1924 was \$276,930, compared with \$355,253 in 1923. There were 1,668 persons (361 male and 807 female) employed in the establishments during the year, compared with 2,083 (1,118 male and 965 female) in the preceding year. The total amounts paid in salaries and wages to the employees of the establishments were \$103,155 in 1924 and \$153,959 in 1923.
