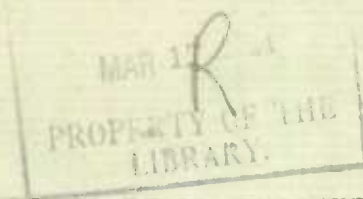

PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1930.

The following preliminary report on the fisheries of Prince Edward Island, for the year 1930, is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The total value of production of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1930 was \$1,252,478, compared with \$1,297,125 in 1929. These totals represent the value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured, or otherwise prepared. The lobster fishery is of chief importance, the value of output of this fishery in 1930 accounting for 64 per cent of the total value of the fisheries production of the province. The lobster pack amounted to 31,935 cases, valued at \$635,961, an increase in quantity over the preceding year of 3,536 cases, but a decrease in value of \$50,979. The average price per case for canned lobster decreased from \$24 in 1929 to \$20 in 1930. The cod and mackerel fisheries show increases over the preceding year in both quantity of catch and marketed value of product, while decreases are recorded for the herring, smelt and oyster fisheries. The total quantity of fish of all kinds caught during the year 1930 amounted to 256,710 cwt., compared with 243,404 cwt. in 1929, and the total value of the fish as caught and landed, i.e., the amount received by the fishermen for the catch, was \$843,618. in 1930, compared with \$933,563 in 1929.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital.— The total amount of capital invested in the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1930 was \$930,037, of which \$740,662 is credited to the vessels, boats, trawls, piers and wharves, etc., engaged in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$189,375 to the fish canning and curing industry. The total capital shows an increase over the preceding year of \$24,912.

Employees.— The industry gave employment during the season of operations in 1930 to 3,495 persons of which 2,281 are classed as fishermen and 1,214 as employees of fish canning and curing establishments.
