

ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1933.

The following report on the fisheries of Prince Edward Island for the year 1933 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

\$842,315, compared with \$988,919 in 1932. These totals represent the value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh or canned, cured or otherwise prepared. The lobster fishery is of chief importance, its product contributing annually over 70 per cent of the total value of the fisheries product of the province. The quantity of lobsters taken in Prince Edward Island waters in 1933 was 91,547 cwt., a decrease from the record year 1932 of 23,023 cwt., or 20 per cent. The catch of 1933, however, was higher than the average of the preceding five years. The marketed value of the lobsters in Prince Edward Island is exclusive of the value of a part of the catch which is sold to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick firms for canning, such shipments (amounting in 1933 to 15,981 cwt.) being included with the values of the provinces where canned and marketed. Other principal kinds of fish are cod, herring and smelts, the first two mentioned showing increases in catch over the preceding year, while the catch of smelts shows a decrease.

The total catch of fish of all kinds, including shell fish, in the province in 1933 was 223,473 cwt., with a value to the fishermen of \$519,165, compared with 237,368 cwt., valued at \$713,552 in 1932.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES


Capital. - The value of the capital investment of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1933 was placed at \$1,109,877, divided as follows: Value of vessels, boats and gear employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, \$927,152; capital investment of fish canning and curing establishments, \$182,725. The total capital shows an increase over the preceding year of \$3,242.

Employees.- The number of persons employed in the fisheries during the season of 1933 was 4,698, including 3,194 fishermen and 1,504 employees of fish canning and curing establishments. The total number shows an increase over the preceding year of 130.




