

ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1934.

The following report on the fisheries of Prince Edward Island for the year 195% is issued by the Cominion Pureau of Statistics, in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The output of Prince Edward Island fisheries in 1934 had a value of \$963,926, compared with \$842,345 in 1933. These totals represent the value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured or otherwise prepared. The lobster fishery is of first importance, the total value of its products in 1854 amounting to \$674,186, or 70 per cent of the total for all fish. Lobster is marketed by the province chiefly as canned, but a considerable part of the catch is shipped each year to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and is shown in the statistical tables with the province where the product is marketed. The total quantity of lobster shipped from Prince Edward Island for marketing in Nova Scotia cwt. and New Brunswick in 1934 was 13,380,/or 17 per cent of the total catch, and this quantity and the value as marketed will be included with the lobster marketed by the two provinces above mentioned. The Prince Edward Island quantity marketed, and the value thereof, is reduced accordingly.

The lobster catch of Prince Edward Island was less than in 1933 by 16 per cent, but the value to the fishermen, owing to higher prices, was increased by 35 per cent. The average price of lobster at the point of landing in 1934 was \$7 per cwt., compared with \$4 per cwt. in 1933. The cod, oyster, herring and smelt fisheries are also of importance, although falling far behind the lobster fishery. The cod fishery had an output in 1934 valued at \$84,445.

The total quantity of fish of all kinds landed by Prince Edward

Island fishermen during the year 1934 was 233,262 cwt., compared with 223,473 cwt.

in the preceding year. Among the principal kinds of fish, increases in catch are shown by cod, make and cusk and cysters.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital.— The total capital investment of the fisheries of the province in 1934 was \$1,097,712, this total comprising \$896,612, the value of the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc. employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$201,100, the investment in fish canning and curing establishments. The total capital shows the small increase of \$3,945 over 1933.

Employees—The number of men engaged in catching and landing the fish was 2,973, while the canneries and fish curing establishments gave employment in the season of operations to 1,501 persons, making a total for all persons employed in the fisheries of the province of 4,474, compared with a total of 4,698 in 1933.
