#### ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF

#### PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1939.

The following report on the fisheries of Prince Edward Island for the year 1939 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

#### PRODUCTION

The fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1939 had a product valued at \$950,412, compared with \$930,874 in 1938. These amounts represent the Value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured, etc. More than half the total value in 1939 is credited to the lobster fishery, whose product was valued at \$539,669. Both the catch and the marketed value of the lobster fishery show decreases compared with the preceding year, but increases over the year 1937. In connection with the lobster fishery it might be noted that considerable quantities taken by Prince Edward Island fishermen are purchased each year by canners in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and that, while the quantity caught and the value as landed are credited to Prince Edward Island, the product and the marketed value thereof are included with the statistics of the provinces where such shipments are marketed. In 1939, Prince Edward Island shipped to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick for marketing, a total of 11,000 cwt. of lobster in shell.

Other important kinds of fish are cod (\$96,858), herring (\$53,858) smelts (\$52,995), and mackerel (\$52,981).

The quantity of fish (including shell fish) taken by Prince Edward Island fishermen in the year totalled 305,661 cwt., with a value at the point of landing of \$683,054, compared with a catch of 294,204 cwt. and a landed value of \$649,074 in 1938. Average prices received by the fishermen showed

only slight changes in comparison with those of the preceding year. Lobsters rose from \$6.44 per cwt. in 1938 to \$6.64 in 1939, cod from 73 cents to 79 cents, and smelts from \$3.55 to \$3.92, but herring dropped from 52 cents to 51 cents and mackerel from \$1.53 to \$1.39.

#### CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital. - The amount of capital invested in the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1939 was \$1,168,253, comprising \$975,378 as the value of the vessels, boats and gear used in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$192,875 as the investment in fish canning and curing establishments, the latter amount covering the value of land, buildings and machinery, the products and materials on hand, and the cash and operating accounts. In comparison with the preceding year, the total amount of capital shows an increase of \$69,287, or 6 per cent.

Employees. - Employed in the fisheries of the province in 1939 were 3,454 fishermen and 1,332 persons in fish canning and curing establishments - a total of 4,786 for the industry. Compared with the year 1938, the number of fishermen shows an increase of 145 and the number of employees in fish canning and curing establishments, an increase of 98, making for the fisheries industry as a whole an increase in number of employees of 243.
