ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1941

The following report on the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in the year 1941 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The value of production of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1941 was \$952,026, compared with \$714,870 in the preceding year. These figures represent the value of the product as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured, etc. The lobster fishery constitutes the most important part of the Prince Edward Island fishing industry, its marketed value of output in 1941 of \$500,592 representing 52.5 per cent of the total for all kinds. Second in importance is the cold fishery with an output valued at \$112,405, or 11.8 per cent of the whole. Compared with 1940 higher prices are recorded for most of the principal fish products.

The total quantity of fish of all kinds landed by Prince Edward Island fishermen was 250,523 cwt., and the value at the point of landing was \$758,464, compared with a catch of 256,363 cwt. and a landed value of \$553,620 in 1939. Average prices paid the fishermen for the principal kinds of fish in 1941 were (per cwt.) as follows, with comparative figures for 1940 in brackets: lobster, \$7.82 (\$6.37); cod \$1.64 (92 cents); mackerel \$1.65 (81 cents); hake 94 cents (50 cents); oysters \$7.95 (\$6.40), smelts \$4.82 (\$4.12); and herring 73 cents (56 cents).

It should be noted in connection with the lobster fishery for this province that considerable quantities of lobsters are shipped annually to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick for canning, and that such shipments, although shown as taken by Prince Edward Island fishermen are not included with Prince Edward Island's marketed quantity and value, but instead are included with the output of the provinces where canned. In the year 1941 the shipments of Prince Edward Island caught lobsters were: to Nova Scotia, 5,468 cwt., and to New Brunswick, 11,238 cwt.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital. - The capital investment of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1941 was \$914,459, a decrease from the preceding year of \$06,938, or 9.5 per cent. The total comprises \$773,359 as the value of the vessels, boats and gear employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$141,100, the amount invested in fish processing plants. There were 65 of these plants in operation in 1941, classified as follows: lobster canneries, 44; clam canneries, 3; other fish canneries, 2; and fish curing establishments, 14.

Employees. -The number of fishermen employed dropped from 2,874 in 1940 to 2,445 in 1941, and the number of persons in the fish processing plants from 996 to 965. The last mentioned number comprises 443 male and 522 female employees. The total number of persons recorded in the fishing industry of Prince Edward Island in 1941 was 3,410, compared with 3,870 in the preceding year.
