#### ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF

#### PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1943

The following report on the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in the year 1945 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

#### PRODUCTION

The value of production of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1943 was \$2,860,946, compared with \$1,639,539 in the preceding year. These figures represent the value of the product as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh or canned, cured, etc. The lobster fishery constitutes the most important part of the Prince Edward Island fishing industry, its marketed value of output in 1943 of \$1,165,008 representing 41 per cent of the total for all kinds. Second in importance is the hake fishery with an output valued at \$567,931, or 20 per cent of the whole. Compared with 1942 higher prices are recorded for most of the principal fish products.

The total quantity of fish of all kinds landed by Prince Edward Island fishermen was 322,405 cwt., and the value at the point of landing was \$1,869,266, compared with a catch of 292,454 cwt. and a landed value of \$1,148,367 in 1942.

Average prices paid to the fishermen for the principal kinds of fish in 1943 were (per cwt.) as follows, with comparative figures for 1942 in brackets: lobster \$16.74 (10.78) hake \$3.81 (1.96); cod \$4.02 (2.48); mackerdl \$4.40 (2.68); oysters \$8.03 (7.13) ; herring \$1.20 (.35 cents) and smelts \$6.84 (4.64).

It should be noted in connection with the lobster fishery for this province that considerable quantities of lobsters are shipped annually to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick for canning, and that such shipments although shown as taken by Prince Edward Island fishermen are not included with Prince Edward Island's marketed quantity and value, but instead are included with the output of the provinces where canned. In the year 1943 the net out shipments of Prince Edward Island caught lobsters were: to Nova Scotia 3,466 cwt., and to New Brunswick 7,712 cwt.

# CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYES

Capital. - The capital investment of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1943 was \$68,704, an increase over the preceding year of \$86,288 or 9.8 per cent. The total comprises \$756,923 as the value of the vessels, boats and gear employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$211,781, the amount invested in fish processing plants. There were 71 of these plants in operation in 1943, classified as follows: lobster canneries, 44; clam cannery, 1; other fish canneries, 18; fish curing establishments,7; and fresh fish and freezing plant,1.

Employees. - The total number of persons employed in the fishing industry in Prince Edward Island in 1943 was 3,454 compared with 3,252 in 1942. Fishermen employed numbered 2,172 in 1943 compared with 2,267 in 1942 and persons engaged in fish processing plants numbered 1,282 (593 male and 689 female) in 1943 compared with 985 (452 male and 533 female) in 1942.
