#### ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 1945.

(Issued in Co-operation with the Dominion Department of Fisheries.)

#### PRODUCTION

In 1945 the total marketed value of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island reached a new high point at \$3,076,631, an increase of \$477,656, or 18.4 per cent over the 1944 figure of \$2,598,975. The increase was caused by both larger quantities caught and by higher prices, although the herring catch was smaller and prices slightly lower.

Lobsters are the mainstay of the fisheries of the Island, accounting for 65 per cent of the value of the total landings and for 49 per cent of the total value of the marketings. Many of the lobsters caught by fishermen of the Province are sold in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and their marketed value is recorded in the fisheries statistics for those provinces. In 1945, the net out-shipments of such crustaceans were 21,776 cwt. to New Brunswick and 1,035 cwt. to Nova Scotia. The value of such out-shipments, at the average landed price, would amount to \$422,460.

The total quantity of fish and shell fish landed in Prince Edward Island was 310,535 cwt., a gain of 14 per cent over the 272,227 cwt. recorded for 1944. The value at the point of landing was \$2,309,147, a gain of 28 per cent over the \$1,797,308 received by the fishermen in 1944. Average prices per cwt. paid to the fishermen in 1945, with the 1944 figures in parentheses, were: lobster, \$18.52 (\$17.47); cod, \$3.71 (\$3.64); hake, \$3.74 (\$2.93); mackerel, \$4.76 (\$4.47); smelts, \$8.11 (\$8.00); cysters (per bbl.), \$9.48 (\$8.55); herring, \$1.02 (\$1.25).

#### CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital. - The capital investment of the fisheries of Prince Edward Island in 1945 was \$1,276,968, an increase over the preceding year of \$93,246 or 8 per cent. The total comprises \$912,644 as the value of the vessels, boats and gear employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$364,324, the amount invested in fish processing plants. There were 68 of these plants in operation in 1945, classified as follows: lobster canneries, 48; clam canneries, 6; other fish canneries, 8; fish curing establishments, 3; fresh fish and freezing plants, 2; and reduction plant, 1.

Employees. - The total number of persons employed in the fishing industry in Prince Edward Island in 1945 was 3,885 compared with 4,045 in 1944. Fishermen employed numbered 2,410 in 1945 compared with 2,269 in 1944 and persons engaged in fish processing plants numbered 1,475 (682 male and 793 female) in 1945 compared with 1,776 (665 male and 1,111 female) in 1944.
