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

#### ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF NEW BRUNSWICK, 1941

The following report on the fisheries of the province of New Brunswick, for the year 1941, is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

#### PRODUCTION

The value of production of the fisheries of New Brunswick in 1941 amounted to \$6,484,831, compared with \$4,965,618 in the preceding year. These figures represent the value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured, etc. Of first importance is the sardine fishery with an output value of \$2,797,072, an increase over 1940 of \$914,212, or 49 per cent. The pack of sardines rose from 504,140 cases, valued at \$1,713,306 in 1940, to 588,663 cases, valued at \$2,141,288 in 1941. The remainder of the catch of sardines was marketed as fresh and salted. The lobster and herring fisheries are second and third on the list in order of value of production, the former with \$1,041,987 and the latter with \$795,746. Increases in marketed value are shown for all the principal kinds of fish excepting smelts, for which reductions in both quantity of catch and marketed value are recorded.

The quantity of fish of all kinds, including shell fish, taken by New Brunswick fishermen during the year, totalled 1,779,264 cwt., with a value at the point of landing of \$2,827,551, compared with a catch of 1,457,323, cwt. and a landed value of \$2,028,399 in 1940. Average prices received by the fisherman for the three principal kinds of fish were: sardines, \$2.14 per bbl., compared with \$1.61; lobster, \$10.78 per cwt., compared with \$8.86; and herring, 48 cents per cwt., compared with 40 cents in 1940.

#### CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

The value of the capital investment of the industry was \$6,677,918, compared with \$6,423,801 in 1940. The total for the year 1941 comprises: \$3,016,534 as the value of the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., employed in catching and landing the fish, and \$3,661,334, the amount invested in fish processing plants.

Employees. The number of men engaged in fishing was 11,212, a reduction from 1940 of 1,213, while the number of persons employed in the fish processing establishmentswas 2,493, an increase of 11. The total number of persons in the fishing industry in 1941 was 13,705, a decrease from 1940 of 1,202.
