



### ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF NEW BRUNSWICK, 1945

The following report on the fisheries of the province of New Brunswick, for the year 1945, is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries.

### PRODUCTION

The value of production of the fisheries of New Brunswick in 1945 amounted to \$13,270,376 compared with \$11,968,692 in the preceding year, an increase of \$1,301,684 or 10.9 p.c. These figures represent the value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh or canned, cured, etc. The lobster fishery is of first importance with a value of \$5,058,701, an increase from 1944 of \$1,629,135 or 47.5 p.c. The pack of lobsters was 16,196 cases, valued at \$777,112 in 1945, compared with 17,444 cases, valued at \$849,843 in 1944. The sardine fishery came second with a marketed value of \$2,909,798, and the herring fishery third with a marketed value of \$1,525,116.

The quantity of fish of all kinds, including shellfish, taken by New Brunswick fishermen during the year totalled 1,556,963 cwt. with a landed value of \$5,477,669 compared with a catch of 1,751,725 cwt. and a landed value of \$5,403,571 in 1944. Average prices received by the fishermen for the three principal kinds of fish were: lobster \$25.57 per cwt. compared with \$22.38 per cwt.; sardines \$3.29 per bbl., the same price as in 1944, and herring \$1.25 per cwt. compared with 83 cents per cwt. in 1944.

### CAPITAL, EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

The value of the capital investment of the industry was \$8,882,204 compared with \$8,439,145 in 1944. The total for the year 1945 comprises: \$3,985,678 as the value of the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., employed in catching and landing the fish and \$4,895,026 the amount invested in fish processing plants.

Employees - The number of men engaged in fishing was 10,768, an increase from 1944 of 376, while the number of persons employed in the fish processing establishments was 3,779, an increase of 355. The total number of persons in the fishing industry in 1945 was 14,547, an increase over 1944 of 731.
