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

ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF QUEBEC, 1938

The following report on the fisheries of Quebec for the year 1938 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Dominion Department of Fisheries and the Quebec Department of Mines and Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The product of the Quebec fisheries (sea and inland combined) in 1938 was valued at \$1,954,377, compared with \$1,892,036 in the preceding year. These totals represent the value of the fish as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, or canned, cured, etc. To the total value in 1938 the sea fisheries contributed \$1,391,792, or 71 per cent, and the inland fisheries, \$562,585, or 29 per cent. Compared with the preceding year the value of the product of the sea fisheries shows an increase of \$83,568, or 6 per cent, but the value of the product of the inland fisheries decreased by \$21,227, or 4 per cent. The cod is the most important single fishery, and its product records an increase in marketed value, over that of the year 1937, of \$95,493. Herring is second to cod in importance, and is followed by lobster, salmon and eel, in the order named.

The quantity of fish of all kinds, including shell fish, taken by Quebec fishermen during the year amounted to 949,589 cwt. and the value at the point of landing was \$1,712,131, compared with a catch of 796,155 cwt. and a landed value of \$1,642,827 in 1937.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

In Primary Operations:

Capital. The capital investment credited to the agencies of production in the primary operations was \$2,258,498, compared with \$2,151,246 in 1937. These figures represent the value of the vessels, boats, nets, traps, wharves, etc. used in catching and landing the fish. To the total of 1938 the sea fisheries contributed \$2,089,252, and the inland fisheries, \$169,246.

Employees.— The number of men employed in the primary operations in 1938 was 12,684, comprising 11,150 men employed in the sea fisheries and 1,534 in the inland fisheries. The total number employed in the preceding year was 11,385.

In Fish Canning and Curing:

Capital. - The amount of capital invested in the fish canning and curing branch of the fisheries industry in 1938 was \$401,586, compared with \$402,094 in the preceding year. Fish canning and curing operations are confined to the sea fisheries and the number of establishments recorded for the year 1938 was 135. Due to the prohibition of lobstering in certain districts, the number of lobster canneries dropped from 54 in 1937 to 16 in 1938.

Employees. - The persons employed in the establishments in 1938 numbered 1,170, compared with 1,171 in the preceding year.
