

#### ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF QUEBEC, 1941.

The following report on the fisheries of Quebec for the year 1941 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Dominion Department of Fisheries and the Quebec Department of Mines and Fisheries.

#### PRODUCTION

Quebec, in common with the other provinces of the Atlantic coast, shows a considerable increase in 1941 in the value of output of the fisheries. The marketed value of production of the sea and inland fisheries of the province, combined, was \$2,842,041, compared with \$2,002,053 in 1940. To the total value the sea fisheries contributed \$2,548,702, an increase over the preceding year of \$846,969, or 50 per cent, and the inland fisheries, a total of \$293,339, a decrease from 1940 of \$6,981, or 2 per cent. Cod is the chief fishery, its marketed value of output in 1941 amounting to \$1,434,162, or 50 per cent of the total for all kinds. Herring (\$285,932) and mackerel (\$257,363) are second and third, respectively, on the list of the chief commercial fishes of the province.

The quantity of fish (sea and inland combined) of all kinds, including shell fish, taken by Quebec fishermen during the year was 968,520 cwt., with a value to the fishermen of \$2,080,432, compared with a catch of 1,029,704 cwt., and a landed value of \$1,611,250 in 1940, showing for 1941 compared with 1940, a decrease in quantity of 61,184 cwt., or 6 per cent, but an increase in landed value of \$469,182 or 29 per cent.

#### CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital. - The capital investment of the fisheries of the province in 1941 had a total value of \$2,854,733, comprising: \$2,017,662, the value of the vessels, boats, nets, piers and wharves, etc. employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish, and \$837,071, the amount invested in fish processing establishments. Compared with the preceding year the total investment shows an increase of \$255,400 or 10 per cent.

Employees. - The number of fishermen employed in 1941 was 10,614, a reduction of 2,656 from the preceding year. The fish processing branch of the industry gave employment to 1,120 persons, an increase of 126. Altogether there were 11,734 persons employed in the fisheries of the province in 1941, compared with 14,264 in 1940.
