ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF QUEBEC, 1944.

The following report on the fisheries of Quebec for the year 1944 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Dominior Department of Fisheries and the Quebec Department of Game and Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The fisheries production of Quebec was valued at \$5,358,677 in 1944, a decrease of nearly 5 p.c. as compared with 1943. The decrease was due to smaller quantities landed, rather than to lower prices, the total quantity having fallen off by over 12 p.c. The sea fisheries contributed \$4,995,977, or 93 p.c., to the total marketed value, the contribution of the inland fisheries being \$362,700, or 7 p.c. Cod is the chief fish in marketed value, at \$2,811,950, or 52 p.c. of the total, followed by mackerel, at \$572,769, or 10 p.c., and lobsters at \$524,023, or 9 p.c.

The quantity of fish of all kinds, including shell fish, taken by Quebec fishermen during the year totalled 1,008,860 cwt., with a value at the point of landing of \$3,974,495, compared with a catch of 1,148,645 cwt., and a landed value of \$3,879,186 in 1943.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

Capital. - The capital investment of the fisheries of Quebec in 1944 had a total value of \$4,127,105 of which the value of the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc. employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish accounted for \$2,170,623 and the amount invested in fish processing establishments, for \$1,956,482.

Employees. - The fisheries industry of the province furnished employment during the year to a total of 10,227 persons, of which 8,420 are classified as fishermen and 1,807 as employees of fish processing establishments. This was a decrease of 1,268 fishermen and an increase of 189 persons in the processing establishments.
