# CONTRACT DRILLING IN THE CANADIAN MINING INDUSTRY, 1947

# Section 1

## Diamond Drilling of Deposits Other Than Fuels

There were 48 firms engaged in contract diamond drilling of Canadian mineral deposits, other than fuels, during 1947, compared with 62 operators in 1946. The income received from drilling operations by these firms totalled \$6,635,476, a decline of 23 per cent from the income of \$8,650,864 in the preceding year. The average number of employees in 1947 was estimated at 1,838 compared with 2,829 in 1946 and the amount of salaries and wages distributed during the year under review totalled \$3,179,473 as against \$5,285,695 in 1946.

The footage drilled in Canada by contractors during 1947 aggregated 4,072,622 feet, a decline of 35 per cent from the previous year's high of 6,260,513 feet. A division of the footage shows 36.7 per cent in Ontario, 34.5 per cent in Quebec, 20.1 per cent in British Columbia and the remainder in the other provinces except Prince Edward Island. The value of borts, ballas, carbons, castset bits, etc., purchased in 1947 by diamond drilling contractors amounted to \$1,418,831 in 1947 compared with \$2,192,615 in 1946.

Equipment owned by the operators in 1947 included 306 steam or air-driven drills, 560 gasoline-driven drills and 3 electric drills.

# Section II

# Contract Drilling for Fuels

In 1947 there were 62 contractors who reported drilling for petroleum, natural gas or for other fuels. The footage drilled totalled 1,253,794 and the income from operations amounted to \$7,484,243 compared respectively with 570,948 and \$2,536,175 in 1946. Of the footage drilled during the year there were 284,313 feet by cable type drills, 2,419 feet by diamond drills and 967,062 feet by rotary drills. Employees engaged in this work in 1947 numbered 1,020 to whom \$2,063,629 were paid in salaries and wages.

Drilling done by oil companies with their own equipment is not included in this report.
