FELDSPAR, 1927

Folispar production in Canada during 1927 emounted to 29,845 tons valued at \$250,151 as compared with 35,951 tons at \$310,238 shipped in the previous year according to finally revised statistics just issued by the Mining, Metallurgical and Chemical Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. The production of feldspar in the United States also declined in 1927, a decrease of 4 per cent in quantity and 11 per cent in value being recorded.

Canadian crude feldspar exported in 1927 totalled 25,648 tons evaluated at \$225,955. Imports of feldspar into Canada continued to increase and amounted to 3,040 tons worth \$50,875 as against 2,441 tons at \$45,975 brought in during 1926.

\$322,978. Employed by the 29 firms operationg in this industry was reported at \$322,978. Employment was furnished 7 salaried employees and 227 wage-earners; their combined earnings were \$151,553. The cost of fuel used during the year was \$10,232.
