FELDSPAR, 1928.

Feldspar production in Canada during 1928 increased 7 per cent in quantity and 10 per cent in value over the totals for 1927, according to finally revised statistics just issued by the mining, metallurgical and chemical branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. The 1928 production was 31,897 tons valued at \$284,942 as compared with shipments of 29,849 tons worth \$259,151 in the previous year. The tonnage of crude feldspar sold or used by producers in the United States during 1923 showed a somewhat similar trend; a 4 per cent increase being recorded.

Exports of Canadian crude feldspar in 1928 totalled 28,101 tons appraised at \$230,945. These exports were principally to the United States. Imports of feldspar into Canada increased slightly, amounting to 3,171 tons worth \$53,818 as against 3,040 tons at \$50,875 imported in 1927.

The 20 firms reporting activities in this industry in 1928 had a capital invested in fixed and current assets of \$237,400. Employment was furnished 8 salaried employees and 215 wage-earners; their total earnings were \$144,660. Fuel costs for the year amounted to \$12,898.
