Salt roduction in Canada durint 1927 amounted to 263,672 tons valued at $41,614,657$, an increase of 2.3 per cent in quantity and 9.1 per cent in value as compared ath the 1926 shiments of 262,547 tons morth $\$ 1,480,149$ according to finally rovico d statistics just issued by the Kinins, Netal lureical and Chenical Branch of the Dominior Burecu of Statistics at Oitaw?. The averase price for all ranes advanced to 36.01 or ton ir 1927 as aegainst $\$ 5.63$ per ton in the previous Hear.

Ontario's production mas 254,121 tons or 9 't. 6 per cent of the canalia total; Ziova Scotia and Alcerte contributed the remainder. Tre Nova Scotia roduction as Nitained from the Calasash mine in Cumberland county; Alberta's production cme from the Fort Re:urray district.

Imxortations of salt into Canada rere recorded at 176,761 tnns anrainod at $\$ 7,082,080$. 2pports of Canadian salt totalled 1,212 tons vort? ;20,793.

The total capital erployed by the 10 operatins firms in this industry was \$3,19'4, 802. Anployment statistios showed an average of $5^{4}$ salaried employees and 322 wage-earmers on the mayroll durinc the year; their earnings totalled ${ }^{\circ} 499,967$. Fuel and slectricity used accounted for an outlay of $\$ 287,260$. Imported bituminous coal was the larsest item among the fuels consumed amounting to 51,167 tons at $\$ 253,009$. Steam enêines in use during the year numbered 22 with a ratine of 567 h .0 . Dlectric notors to a total of 72 units rated at $966 \mathrm{~h} . \mathrm{p}$. were also in operation durine 1927 .
