THIE STONT INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1928.
The stone industry in Canada comprises two main divisions: (a) The Stone
Quarrying Industry, including quarries and dressing works operated in conjunction with quarries; and (b) The Monumental and Omamental stone Industry, comprising the operutions of firms which have no quarries, but who operate dressing works जhere stone for building and monumental purposes is cut, polished or otherwise finished.

In the Canadian stone industry as a whole in 1928 there were 476 fims having a total capital investmont of $22,333,066$, according to finally reviscd statistics compiled by the mining, metallurgical and chemical branch of tho Dominion Bureau of Statistice at Ottawa. Production during the year was valued at $14,987,435$, which included the value of the quarry output and the value added by manufacturing in the sccondary stone industry. Inployment was furnished 6,815 porsors and their total earnings amountod to i,7,385,221.

In the following paces, the two industrics aro roviowod soparatoly.
(1). PRIMARI PRODUCIION - The Stone Quarrying Industry includes data on stone quarries and on dressing works operited in conjunction with quarries.

Stone production from Canadian quarries during 1928 advanced 12.97 per cent in quantity and 10.87 per cent in value; the total shipments were $8,253,934$ tons valued 9265314 at $10,272,301$ as compared with 7,306,436 tons worth $97,665,874$ shipped in 1927. Ontario was the leading producer, accounting lor 55.5 per cent of the total output; Queboc followed with 36.3 per cent and the other provinces in order of tonnages produced were: British Columbia, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Alberta.

* Capital employed by the 254 firms operating in tho stono quarrying indus try in, Hanadr in 1928 was reportod at ${ }_{\$ 1}^{4} 16,027,547$. Salariod employeos and wage-earners amployed during the yoar totalled 5,129 ; thoir combince carnings amountod to $4,8,806,514$. Fucl and cloctricity usod during 1928 cost $\$ 579,086$.

(2). SECONDARY PRODUCTION - The Monumental and Ornamental Stone Industry includes
ins cutting, polishing on other fimishing of stone in plants not opratsi in conjunotion with quarries.

Production from the 222 stone dressing works in the Dominicn rose to a new high level of ${ }_{2}^{2} 7,276,034$ in 1928 as compared with a total of $\$ 5,606,984$ in 2927. These totals include cut and polished stone for ornamental, monumental and building purposes; the largest single item for 1928 was limestone for building which was valued at $\$ 2,861,336$. Distribution by provinces of the plants in operation during 1928 wes as follows: Ontario, $218 ;$ Quebec, 45 ; Manitoba, 13; British Columbia, 11 ; New Brunswick, 10; Nova Scot1a, 10; Saskatchewan, 8; Alberta, 5; and Prince Edward Island, 2. Stone used in these plants during 1928 cost $\$ 2,460,900$; capital employed amounted to $\$ 6,305,519$; employees numbered 1,686 , and salaries and wages totalled $\$ 2,578,707$.

Lers me vat 920 were valued at $\{1,550,447$, an increase of approximately 40 per cent over the total Ior 1927 of $1,110,100$. Granite imports in 1928 were appraised at $\$ 248,444$ made up of importations from the United Kingdom valued at ;91,324; the United States, 56,350 ; Germany, 37,495 ; Sweden, $27, \angle 21$; Finland, 21,229; Czechoslovakia, 313,804 ; and minor shipments from Switzerland, France and Italy. Paving blocks worth 10,919 wcre Drought into Canada from the United Statos. Imports of marblo (rough, sawn and manufactures of) into Cirada in 1928 mere valued at $\{433,923$; producers in the United States suppliod 69.8 por cent or $\$ 302,903$; those in Italy, 23.4 por cont or 4101,424 ; and the romainder, in ordor of import value, camo from Bclgium, France, tho Unitod Kingdom, Gormany, Swodon, Finland, Cuba, Czochoslovakia, Austria, Switzerland and British India. Other building stono and flagstone to a value of $\$ 412,882$ more importod in 1928, principally from tho United States. In 1928, Canada imported fram the Unitod Statcs and Nowfoundland rofusc stono amounting to 597,134 tons worth 373,453. Exports of Canadian stono wore valuod at "\$250,215, as compared vith il41,3C6 for 1927; incruascd cxports of crushod stonc accountcd for this advance.
