

(2) SECONDARY PRODUCTION - The Monumental and Ornamental Stone Industry -

Production from the stone dressing works in 1930 amounted in value to \$8,355,605. This was a new record for the industry and exceeded the 1929 output by about two per cent. During 1930 a total of 226 plants in Canada were engaged solely in the cutting or dressing of stone for building or ornamental purposes. Of this total 118 plants were located in the province of Ontario, 44 in Quebec, 15 in Manitoba, 12 in British Columbia, 11 in New Brunswick, 11 in Nova Scotia, 8 in Saskatchewan, 5 in Alberta, and 2 in Prince Edward Island. These concerns had an operating capital of \$7,468,687 and afforded employment to a monthly average of 1,919 people who received \$3,044,877 as salaries and wages. Unfinished stone purchased for polishing or dressing cost \$2,759,870 and the selling value of the finished stone was \$8,355,605, giving \$5,595,735 as the value added to purchased materials by the cutting and finishing processes.



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(3) IMPORTS AND EXPORTS OF STONE - The total imports of stone, including slate, during 1930 were valued at \$1,946,486, a decrease of 17.7 per cent below the 1929 importations of \$2,365,091. Granite imports in 1930 were appraised at \$262,012 consisting of importations from the United Kingdom valued at \$92,674; the United States, \$63,938; Sweden, \$27,391; Finland, \$24,871; Germany, \$9,274; Czechoslovakia, \$9,157; and minor shipments from Italy and the Netherlands. Marble, rough, sawn, and manufactures of, imported into Canada during the year was valued at \$678,491; receipts from the United States accounted for 72.8 per cent or \$494,588; from Italy, \$109,084; the remainder, in order of import value, came from Belgium, France, the United Kingdom, Germany, Sweden, Austria, Switzerland, and China. Other building stone and flagstone to a value of \$498,646 were imported during 1930, principally from the United States. Refuse stone to a total of 303,462 tons valued at \$233,182 was imported from the United States and Newfoundland during 1930.

Exports of Canadian stone increased 16.9 per cent to a value of \$277,258 as compared with \$237,121 recorded for 1929.
