## TALC AD SOAPSTONE, 1928.

Production of tale and soapstone in Canada during 1928 was valued at \$219,358, according to finally revised statistics just issued by the mining, metallurgical and chemical branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In 1927 shipments amounted to 16,521 tons valued at \$236,105.

Quebec shipments were made from quarries in the Eastern townships and consisted principally of soapstone blocks for use in lining the alkali recovery furnaces of sulphate (kraft) pulp mills. Ontario's production was wholly of tale obtained from deposits near Madoc, Hastings county.

Imports into Canada during 1928 of tale or scapstone, ground or unground, under to 5,421 tons appraised at \$91,702. Exports of tale were recorded at 10,946 tons worth \$133,601.

Capital employed by the 5 firms operating in this industry was reported at \$732,608. Employment was furnished 9 salaried employees and 82 wage-earners; their total earnings were \$85,161. Fuel and electricity used during the year cost \$21,850.
