The production of talc and soapstone in Canada during 1931 Tas valued at $\$ 157,083$ as compared with an output valued at $\$ 186,215$ in 1930 , according to finally revised statistics fust issued by the Mininz, Metallurgical and Chemical Branch of the Dominion Bureau of statistics at Ottama.

SQapstone produced in Quebec is shipped in the lform of blocks and powder; in Ontario a high grade talc is minedfanaiforound near Madoc. Sinments from the latter province were madelti Furove, United States and points in Canada. Some crude talc was produced dursng 1931 at Leechtom, Victoria minine division, British Columbia.

The physical characteristics of talcplergely determine its usefulness.
The mineral is now being used in paper making, toilet preperations, paints, cements, rubber, textiles, lubricants, ceramics, insulators and in various other products and industrial processes; off colour talc is consumed in increasing amounts for rock dusting coal mines.
