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NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, NOVEMBER, 1931.

Canadian wells produced 2,539,948 thousand cubic feet of natural gas in November as compared with 1,901,073 thousand cubic feet in October and 2,929,939 thousand cubic feet in November, 1930. During the month under review Alberta wells accounted for 71.7 per cent of the Canadian total; Ontario, 26.2 per cent; and New Brunswick, 2.1 per cent. Output to the end of November totalled 23,729,065 thousand cubic feet, a decline of 9.7 per cent from the production during the corresponding months of last year.

The Alberta provincial government's proposed restrictive measures for the conservation of the Turner Valley natural gas continued to be the subject of much discussion in November on the part of the various oil companies interested in this field.

Imports of mixed gas (natural and artificial) into Canada amounted to 8,382 thousand cubic feet valued at \$7,116; in October, 8,265 thousand cubic feet at \$3,546 were imported. Importations during the eleven months ending November, 1931, totalled 110,661 thousand cubic feet appraised at \$68,107.
