SILVER PRODUCTION IN CANADA

OCTOBER, 1931.

Silver production in Canada during October amounted to 1,697,052 ounces, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In September the production was 1,238,741 ounces and in October, 1930, the output was 1,948,412 ounces. Ontario was the leading producing province during the month under review and accounted for 41.7 per cent of the total production. British Columbia produced 37.5 per cent, the Yukon, 13.2 per cent, Manitoba, 4.9 per cent, and Quebec, 2.7 per cent. Production during the first ten months of the current year totalled 18,259,971 ounces or 15.6 per cent below the total for the corresponding period of last year.

Quotations for silver on the New York market showed a slight upward trend during October and the average for the month of 29 536 cents per ounce (New York funds) was the high for the year to date. This average price in Canadian funds was 33.1815 cents per ounce at which price the Canadian production in October was worth \$563,107.

Production of silver in the United States increased 5.2 per cent in October to a total of 2,211,000 ounces Peru's cutput advanced 8.4 per cent, while Australia's figures showed a decline of 17 per cent
