

SILVER PRODUCTION IN CANADA, NOVEMBER, 1931.

Canadian producers reported an output of 1,548,377 ounces of silver during November as compared with 1,697,052 ounces in October and 2,337,397 ounces in November, 1930, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. British Columbia accounted for 41.98 per cent of the current month's production; Ontario, 37.1 per cent; the Yukon, 12.58 per cent; Manitoba, 5.29 per cent; Quebec, 3.05 per cent. During the eleven months ending November, Canadian output totalled 19,803,346 ounces, a decline of 17.4 per cent from the production in the corresponding months of 1930.

On the New York market silver quotations showed an appreciable advance in November; the average for the month was 32.223 cents per ounce (New York funds) as compared with 29,538 cents per ounce in October. In Canadian funds the average price was 36.1919 cents per ounce at which price the total Canadian production was worth \$560,387.

The United States output of silver in November amounted to 2,012,000 ounces, a falling-off of 7.7 per cent from the October total of 2,181,000 ounces. Production in Peru was 578,000 ounces or 5.1 per cent below the October total. Australia's output of 561,000 ounces was 29.6 per, cent higher than in the previous month.

Production in the United States during the eleven months ending November totalled 29.110.000 ounces as against 46.521.000 ounces in the corresponding period of last year.
