COPPER, 1929.

Finally revised statistics on the output of copper in Canada as reported by the mining, metallurgical and chemical bland to Domition Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa, show a production in 1929 of 248,120,760 pouhds valued at (43,415,251 as compared with 202,696,046 pounds valued at \$28,598,249 in 1928. This was an increase of 22 per cent in quantity and 52 per cent in value and marked the attainment of the largest output ever recorded for the Dominion. In 1929 Canada was the world's fourth largest copper-producing country, being exceeded only the United States, Chile and Africa. Increases in production were noted in all copper-producing provinces and much development work was carried on in Manitoba where large copper deposits are being rapidly brought to the production stage. The Horne Copper Corporation is the principal producer in Quebec; the International Nickel Company was responsible for practically all of Ontario's output; the Granby Consolidated Mining, Smelting and Power Company, Limited, which operates mines at Hidden Creek and Copper Mountain, B.C., and the Erstannia Mining and Smelting Company, Limited, operating the Britannia mine on Howe Sound, produce the larger part of the output from British Columbias Blister copper was made by the Granby Consolidated at Anyox, B.C., by the Consolidated Mining & Smalting Company at Trail, B.C., where it was also refined; at Port Colborne, Ontario, by the International Nickel Company and at Noranda, P.Q., by the Herne Copper Corporation.

Concentrates made from the ores of the Britannia and Copper Mountain properties in British Columbia, and the Eustis mine in Quebec, were exported to the United States for treatment in 1929.
