IRON OXIDES (4)5

According to finally revised statistics just issued by the Mining, Metallurgical and Chemical Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa, the production of iron oxides in Canada during 1925 was 7,118 tons valued at \$91,913. In 1924 the total shipments amounted to 7,266 tons at \$91,160. Iron oxides are marketed in Canada in two forms, namely, crude and calcined. Crude oxides are dried before shipment for use in the purification of illuminating gas, while the calcined product is ground usually for consumption in the paint industry.

Capital employed in the iron oxide industry in Canada in 1925 was reported at \$173,940. Salaries and wages paid to the 47 employees in this industry totalled \$35,454. The cost of fuel and electricity used during the year was \$16,073.
