ZINC, 1927

Finally revised statistics on the production of Zinc in Canada for the year 1927, as reported by the Mining, Metallurgical and Chemical Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, show that a new high record in quantity was established, but owing to the decrease in the price of this metal the total value of the output was less than in 1926. The 1927 production amounted to 165,495,525 pounds which, when valued at the average London price for the year of 6.194 cents per pound, was worth \$10,250,793. The 1926 output of 149,938,105 pounds valued at the average London price for the year of 7.41 cents perpound was worth \$11,110,413.

Canada's zinc production includes the metallic zinc produced by the Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company. Limited, of Tadanac, B.C., from the ores of Sullivan mine and other mines of the east and west Kootenay districts; and the recoverable zinc in ores exported, both from British Columbia and from the Tetreault silver-lead-zinc properties in Quebec. While no other provinces reported a production in 1927, large developments are under way on zinc properties in the Sudbury district near Chelmsford, Ontario, and on the copper-zinc deposits of northwestern Manitoba and of northwestern Quebec.
