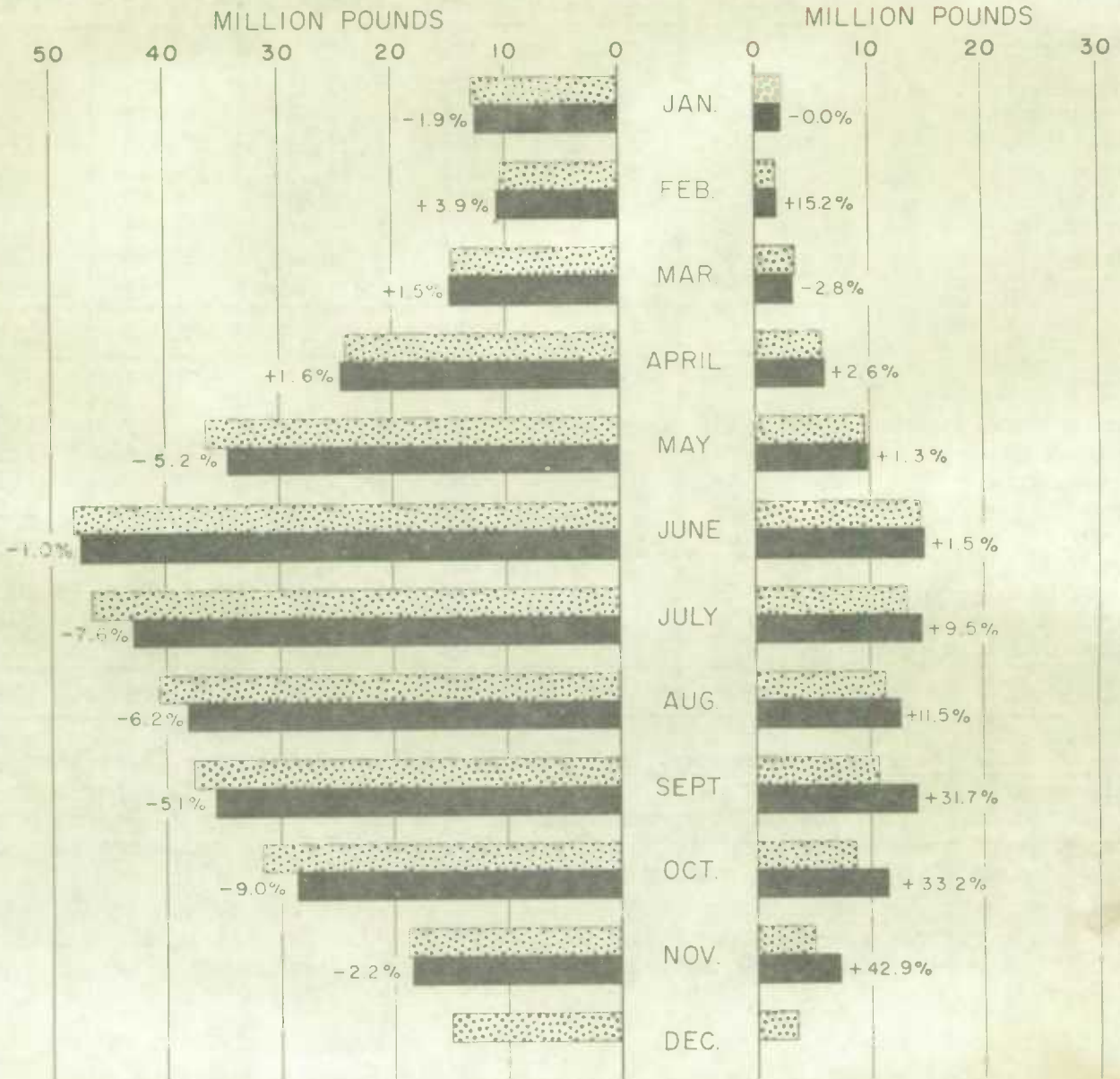

The Domestic Disappearance of Creamery Butter in Canada during November, according to preliminary production and stock data, amounted to 34,397,000 pounds, 31.8 per cent more than the 26,102,000 pounds in November, 1958. Cumulative January to November disappearance of creamery butter, at 285,801,000 pounds was 0.5 per cent more than the 284,396,000 pounds in the corresponding period of 1958.

Official trade figures are not yet available but it is estimated that about 10 million pounds of butter were exported in November. Domestic disappearance would be correspondingly reduced.
