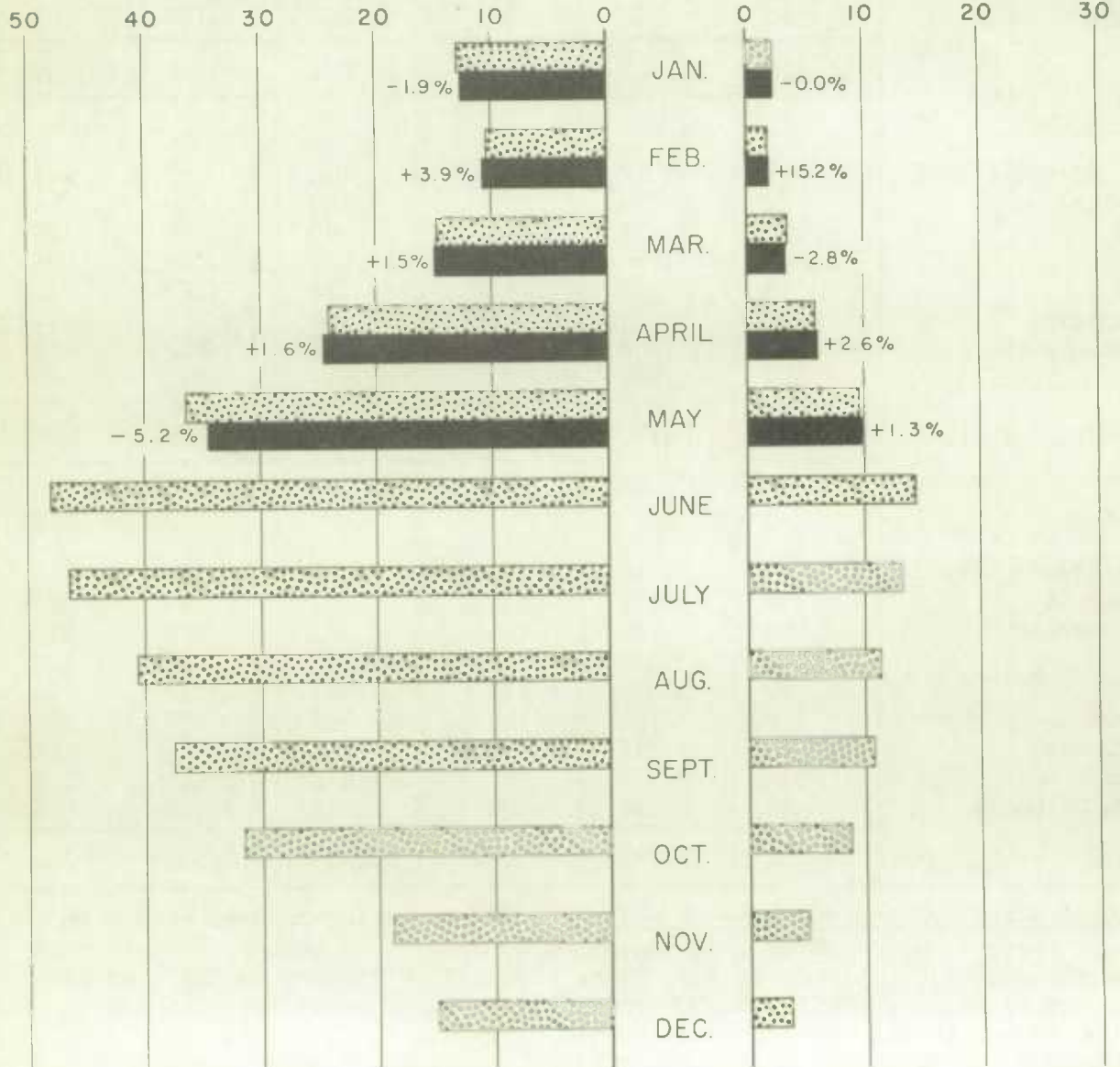

The Domestic Disappearance of Creamery Butter in Canada during May, according to preliminary production and stock data, amounted to 25,171,000 pounds, 6.1 per cent less than the 26,800,000 pounds in May, 1958. Cumulative January to May disappearance of creamery butter, at 119,102,000 pounds was 3.3 per cent less than the 123,110,000 pounds in the corresponding period of 1958.
