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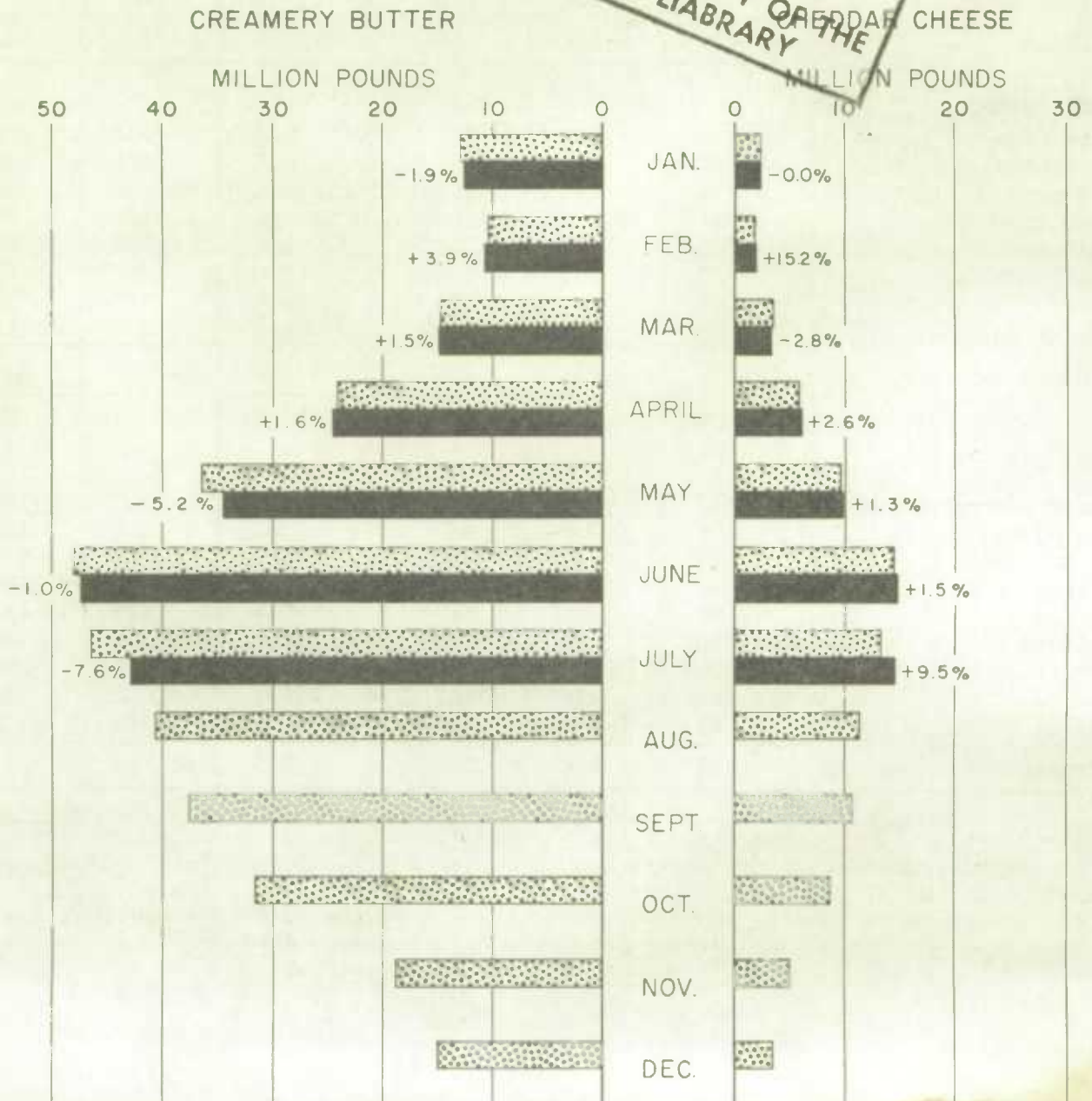

Cumulative January to July disappearance of creamery butter, at 169,209,000 pounds was 3.8 per cent less than the 175,811,000 pounds in the corresponding period of 1958.
