

The Domestic Disappearance of Creamery Butter in Canada during September, according to preliminary production and stock data, amounted to 26,702,000 pounds, 4.6 per cent less than the 27,997,000 pounds in September,1958. Cumulative January to September disappearance of creamery butter, at 220,931,000 pounds was 3.6 per cent less than the 229,097,000 pounds in the corresponding period of 1958.
