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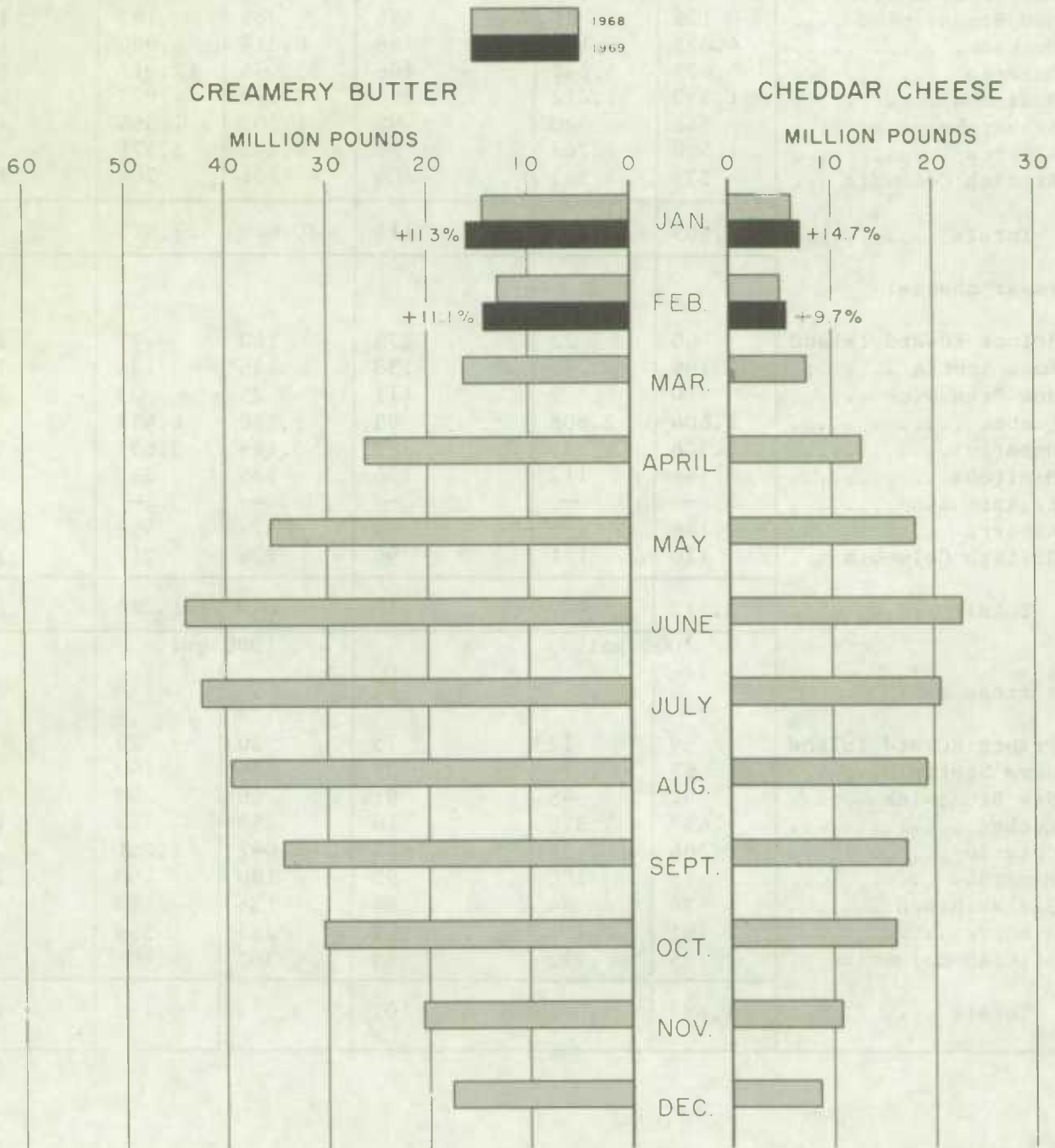

Production of evaporated whole milk and skim milk powder in Quebec and Ontario during February with the corresponding figure for the last February in brackets, was as follows: Evaporated whole milk - Quebec, 3,785,000 lb. (3,387,000 lb.); Ontario, 4,451,000 lb. (6,555,000 lb.); skim milk powder - Quebec, 6,094,000 lb. (6,031,000 lb.); Ontario, 6,591,000 lb. (5,582,000 lb.).
