



## OILS AND FATS

#### JANUARY 1968

The monthly Oils and Fats Survey is designed to show domestic production and utilization of edible oils. To meet the requirements of domestic producers and other agencies interested in edible oils and by-products therefrom, the 1968 data are collected in greater detail which necessitated realignment of the tabular presentations within this publication. The following explanatory comments are offered to assist in the interpretation of the respective tables.

TABLE 1: Shows the domestic production of deodorized oil formulated to produce Margarine, Shortening and Salad Oils.

#### Production includes:

- (a) Production of oils from primary products to fully deodorized edible products ready for packaging or bulk shipment.
- (b) Processing crude or partially prepared oils from that state to fully deodorized oils ready for packaging or bulk shipment.
- TABLE 2: Essentially this table shows the volume of oils purchased by packaging establishments from domestic refineries and the volume of imported oils. The quantity data would exclude the volume of deodorized oil utilized by those establishments which produce end products from primary materials or partially processed oils.
- TABLES 3, 6 and 7: Refer to total sales by primary and secondary manufacturers; bulk oil sales would represent the volume moved to secondary producers for packaging or other end use. Retail and Commercial packaged volume represent end products and portray a measurement of the volume moved by domestic producers to the market for the period under review.
- TABLE 8: Refers specifically to domestic vegetable oil mills, and shows the volume of oilseed utilized and the yield of oil and oil meal products. The oil produced is total volume which would include edible oils, oils for other end use and exports.
- TABLE 9 and 10: Shows the production data on Lards and Tallows. The processed Lard and Edible Tallow figure are NOT additive to animal oils shown in other tables within this publication.


