PRODUCTION OF BUTTER AND CHEESE

The production of creamery butter in Canada during the month of October, 1936 amounted to 23,005,256 pounds as compared with 21,276,553 pounds in October, 1935, an increase of 1.7 million pounds or 8.1 per cent. The cumulative production for the ten months ending October amounted to 226,205,658 pounds as compared with 217,526,856 pounds during the same period of 1935, an increase of over 8.6 million pounds or 4 per cent.

Cheese production in Canada in the month of October, 1936 reached a total of 15,090,422 pounds. In the four provinces, Quebec, Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia for which comparative data are available for the same month of 1935, an increase of 1.9 million pounds or 14.8 per cent is recorded. The cumulative production from January 1 to October 30, 1936, amounted to 110,287,269 pounds. Making comparisons with the same period of last year on the basis of returns from the four provinces already mentioned, an increase of approximately 16 million pounds or 17.6 per cent is indicated.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Creamery butter reported in cold storage warehouses and creameries at November 1, 1936 amounted to 52,327,059 pounds. Making an estimate to cover the holdings of firms that failed to report, this figure is increased by 924,302 pounds, giving a grand total of 53,351,361 pounds. Of this amount 39,072,919 pounds were held in cold storage warehouses and 14,178,442 pounds in creameries. Estimated stocks shown in the Canada totals are not included in the figures by provinces. Comparing the grand total as at November 1, 1936, with stocks reported at the same date of the previous year, an increase of nearly 5 million pounds or 10.2 per cent is shown, and compared with the holdings at the first of the previous month, there was a decrease of approximately 2 million pounds or 3.6 per cent. The holdings of new firms added to the list since November 1, 1935 amounted to approximately 514 thousand pounds. Stocks of butter in the custody of railways, at terminals and in transit which are separately reported in this statement, amounted to 476 thousand pounds as compared with 448 thousand pounds a year ago.

Dairy butter stocks reported at November 1, 1936, amounted to 307,588 pounds. Adding an estimate of 2,108 pounds, gives a grand total of 309,696 pounds. Compared with November 1, 1935, these stocks represent a decrease of 75 thousand pounds or 19.6 per cent, and in comparison with the corresponding figure for the previous month, a decrease of 58 thousand pounds or 15.8 per cent is recorded.

Stocks of cheese reported in cold storages and dairy factories at November 1, 1936 amounted to 32,662,594 pounds. With the addition of 515,574 pounds to cover outstanding firms there is shown a grand total of 33,178,168 pounds. Compared with the same date last year these stocks represent an increase of approximately 4.9 million pounds or 17.3 per cent, and with the previous month a decrease of nearly 5.5 million pounds or 14.1 per cent. Stocks contributed by new firms which were added to the list since January 1, 1936 amounted to approximately 1,683,000 pounds.

The reported holdings of cold storage eggs on November 1, 1936 were 6,909,400 dozens, which with estimated stocks of 113,660 dozens gives a grand total of 7,023,060 dozens. These holdings represent an increase of approximately 516 thousand dozens or 7.9 per cent over those reported at the same date last year, and a decrease of 2.9 million dozens or 29.5 per cent as compared with the stocks reported at the first of the previous month. Fresh eggs amounted to 182,951 dozens which includes 15,328 dozens of estimated stocks. Comparing these stocks with those reported at the same date of the previous year a decrease of approximately 43 thousand dozens or 19 per cent is recorded, and with the previous month a decrease of approximately 268 thousand dozens or 59.4 per cent. Frozen eggs reported at November 1, 1936, amounted to 4,399,510 pounds, and these together with estimated stocks of 9,487 pounds gives a grand total of 4,408,997 pounds. These holdings represent an increase of approximately 967 thousand pounds or 28.1 per cent over the stocks in store at November 1, 1935, and a decrease of approximately 615 thousand pounds or 12.2 per cent as compared with those reported at the first of the previous month. Unclassified stocks of eggs in transit amounted to 117,840 dozens compared with 88,380 dozens a year ago. The former figure includes 14,730 dozens consigned for export.

Concentrated whole milk products amounted to 11,674,872 pounds on November 1, 1936. In comparison with the quantities reported at the same date in 1935 there was a decrease of approximately 1.7 million pounds or 12.6 per cent, and compared with the holdings at the first of the previous month, a decrease of approximately one million pounds or 8.8 per cent. Stocks of concentrated milk by-products were reported as 2,104,425 pounds, representing decreases of approximately 2 million pounds from the November 1, 1935, and approximately 94 thousand pounds below the holdings reported at October 1, 1936.

Stocks of poultry, including estimated holdings of 33,056 pounds, amounted to 5,336,095 pounds, representing gains over the previous year and the previous month of 2.5 million pounds and 1.3 million pounds respectively. Transit stocks were 157,000 pounds as against 66,000 pounds a year ago. Of this amount, 25,000 pounds was consigned for export.





PRODUCTION OF CREAMERY BUTTER IN CANADA BY PROVINCES, OCTOBER, 1936.

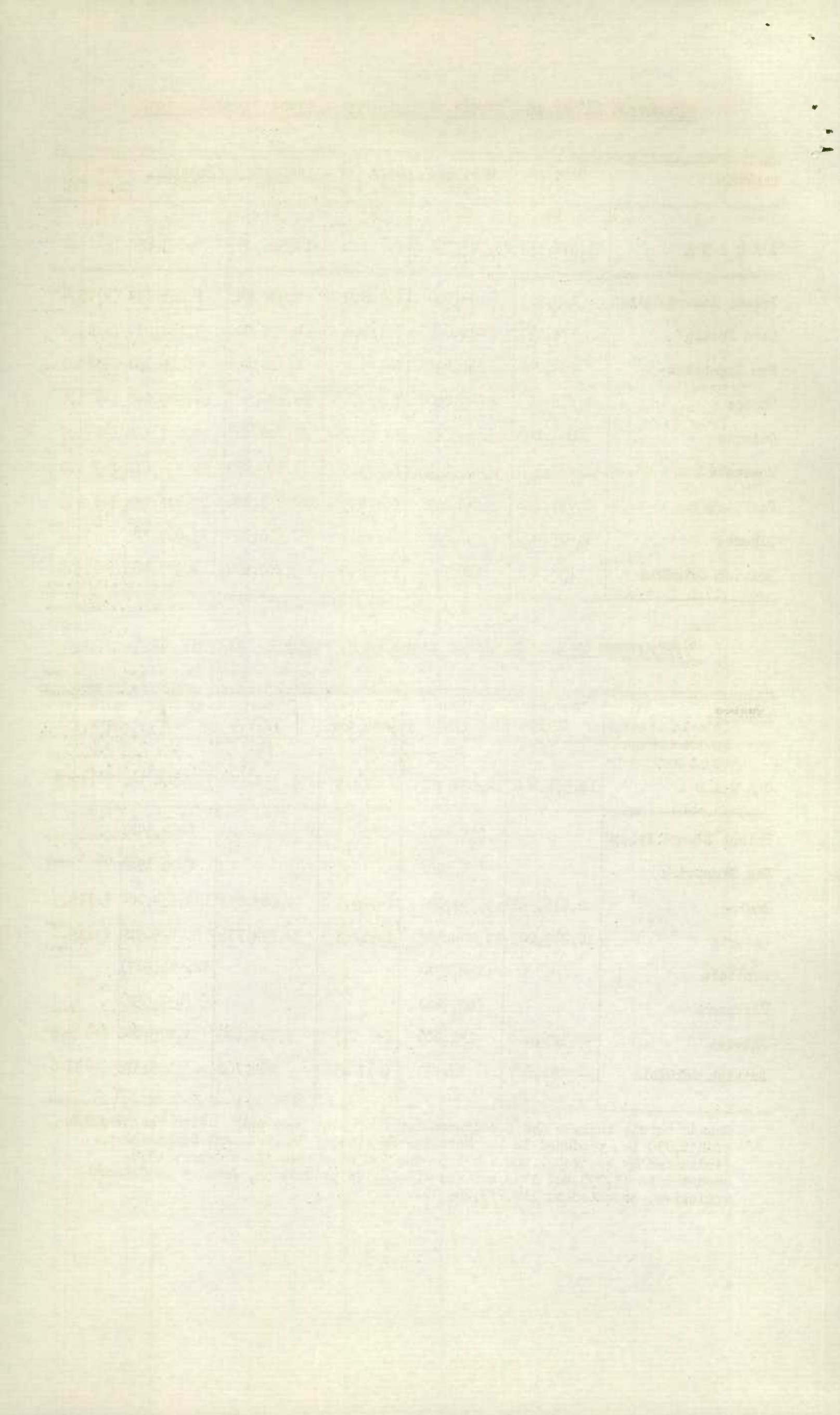

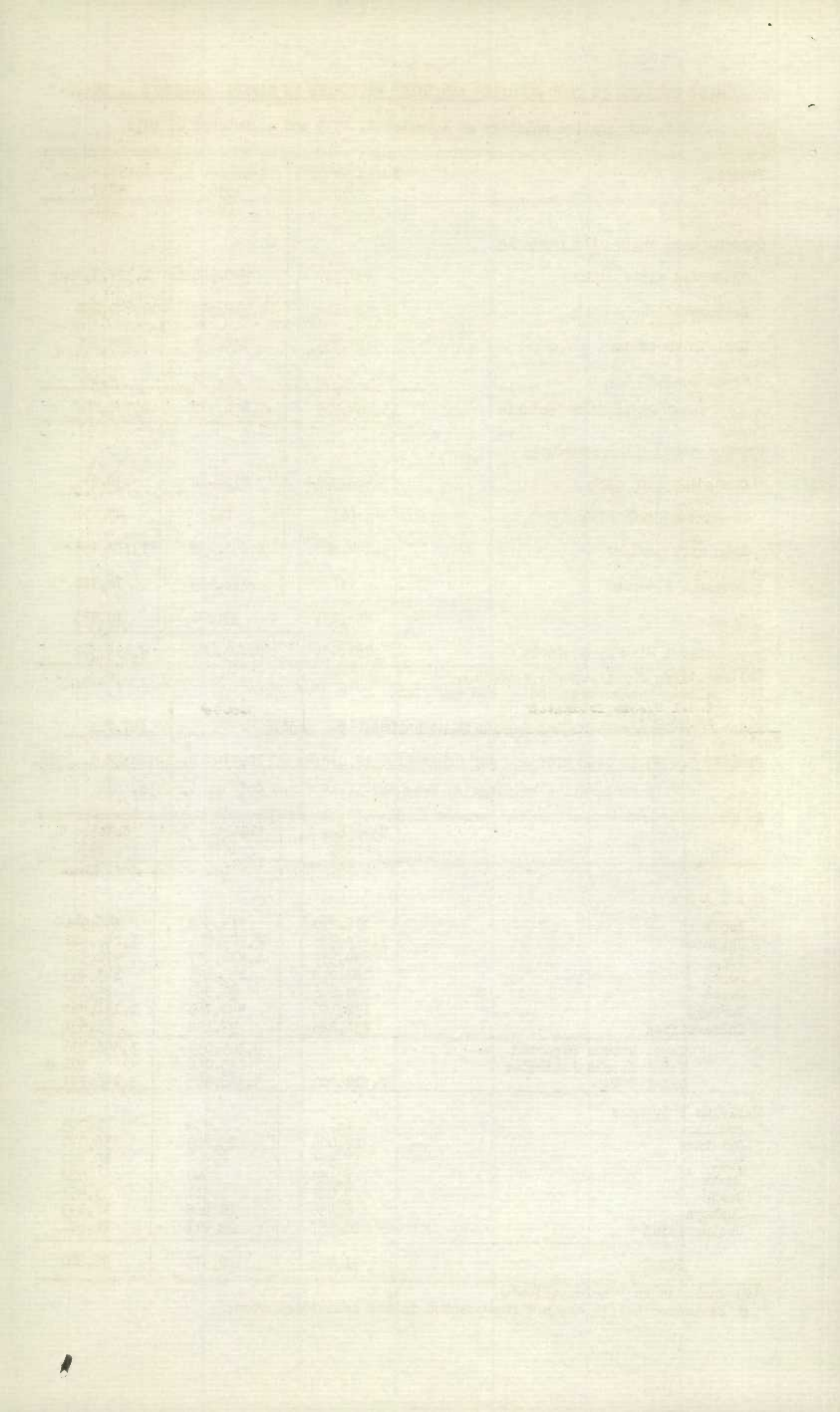
