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PRODUCTION OF BUTTER AND CHEESE

The production of creamery butter in Canada during the month of July, 1936, amounted to 36,617,835 pounds, compared with 36,887,654 pounds in July 1935, or a decrease of 0.7 per cent. The cumulative production for the seven months ending in July amounted to 141,115,671 pounds, as compared with 134,438,218 pounds or an increase of 5 per cent above the output of the January to July period of 1935.

Cheese production in Quebec, Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia in the month of July, 1936, amounted to 20,872,551 pounds, compared with 18,363,960 pounds in July, 1935, or an increase of 13.7 per cent. In comparison with the output of the previous month, there was an increase of approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ million pounds. Production figures for the other four provinces in which cheese is produced, are given for July, 1936 only, and amount to 396,816 pounds, making a total production of 21,269,367 pounds for the whole of Canada in July, 1936. The cumulative production during the period from January 1 to July 31, 1936, in the four provinces for which data are available, amounted to 54,147,614 pounds as compared with 45,258,822 pounds, or an increase of 19.6 per cent over the corresponding period of last year.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Creamery butter reported in cold storage warehouses and creameries at August 1, 1936 amounted to 40,617,503 pounds. Making an estimate for the holdings of outstanding firms, this figure is increased by 903,272 pounds, making a grand total of 41,520,775 pounds. Of this amount, 28,437,647 pounds represents the holdings in cold storage warehouses and 13,083,128 pounds the holdings in creameries. Estimates made by provinces are included in the provincial totals. Comparing the grand total as shown at August 1, 1936 with stocks reported at the same date of the previous year, an increase of approximately 1 million pounds or 2.0 per cent is shown, and with the holdings at the first of the previous month an increase of approximately 14 million pounds is recorded. The holdings of new firms added to the list since September 1, 1935 amounted to approximately 295,000 pounds.

Dairy butter stocks as reported by all firms, amounted to 320,909 pounds as compared with 539,900 pounds reported at August 1, 1935, and 213,493 pounds at the first of July of this year.

The stocks of cheese reported in cold storages and dairy factories at August 1, 1936, amounted to 28,834,903 pounds. Adding 743,977 pounds as representing the estimated holdings of outstanding firms, the holdings reach a grand total of 29,578,880 pounds. Compared with the same date last year there was a decrease of approximately 19 thousand pounds or .07 per cent, and with the previous month, an increase of approximately $6\frac{1}{2}$ million pounds or 28.7 per cent.

The reported holdings of fresh eggs amounted to 362,041 dozens, and these, together with the estimated stocks amounting to 15,438 dozens, gives a grand total of 377,479 dozens. These holdings represent decreases of approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ thousand dozens or 0.7 per cent from August 1, 1935, and about 167 thousand dozens or approximately 31 per cent from the stocks reported at the previous month. Cold storage eggs amounted to 9,858,323 dozens, including 212,254 dozens of estimated stocks. Comparing the grand total with those reported at the same date of the previous year there is an increase of approximately 208 thousand dozens or 2.1 per cent, and with the July 1 holdings, an increase of approximately 105 thousand dozens or 1.0 per cent. Frozen stocks were reported at August 1, 1936 as 5,083,430 pounds, and these, together with the estimated stocks amounting to 4,545 pounds, gives a grand total of 5,087,975 pounds. These holdings represent increases of about 872 thousand pounds or 20.790 pounds over August 1, 1935, and about 870 thousand pounds or 20.6 per cent over the stocks reported at the previous month.

Concentrated whole milk products amounted to 10,220,385 pounds on August 1, 1936, a decrease of about 3 million pounds, or 24.0 per cent from the same date in 1935, and a decrease of over 1 million pounds or 11.9 per cent from the amount reported at the first of previous month.

Stocks of poultry at the first of August, 1936, as shown by firms reporting at that date amounted to 4,096,687 pounds. The addition of the estimated holdings of 81,281 pounds, produces a grand total of 4,177,968 pounds. When this figure is compared with the stocks reported at August 1, 1935, an increase of approximately 1 million pounds or 44 per cent is revealed. Comparisons made with the holdings at July 1, 1936, however, show a decrease of approximately 451 thousand pounds or 9.7 per cent.

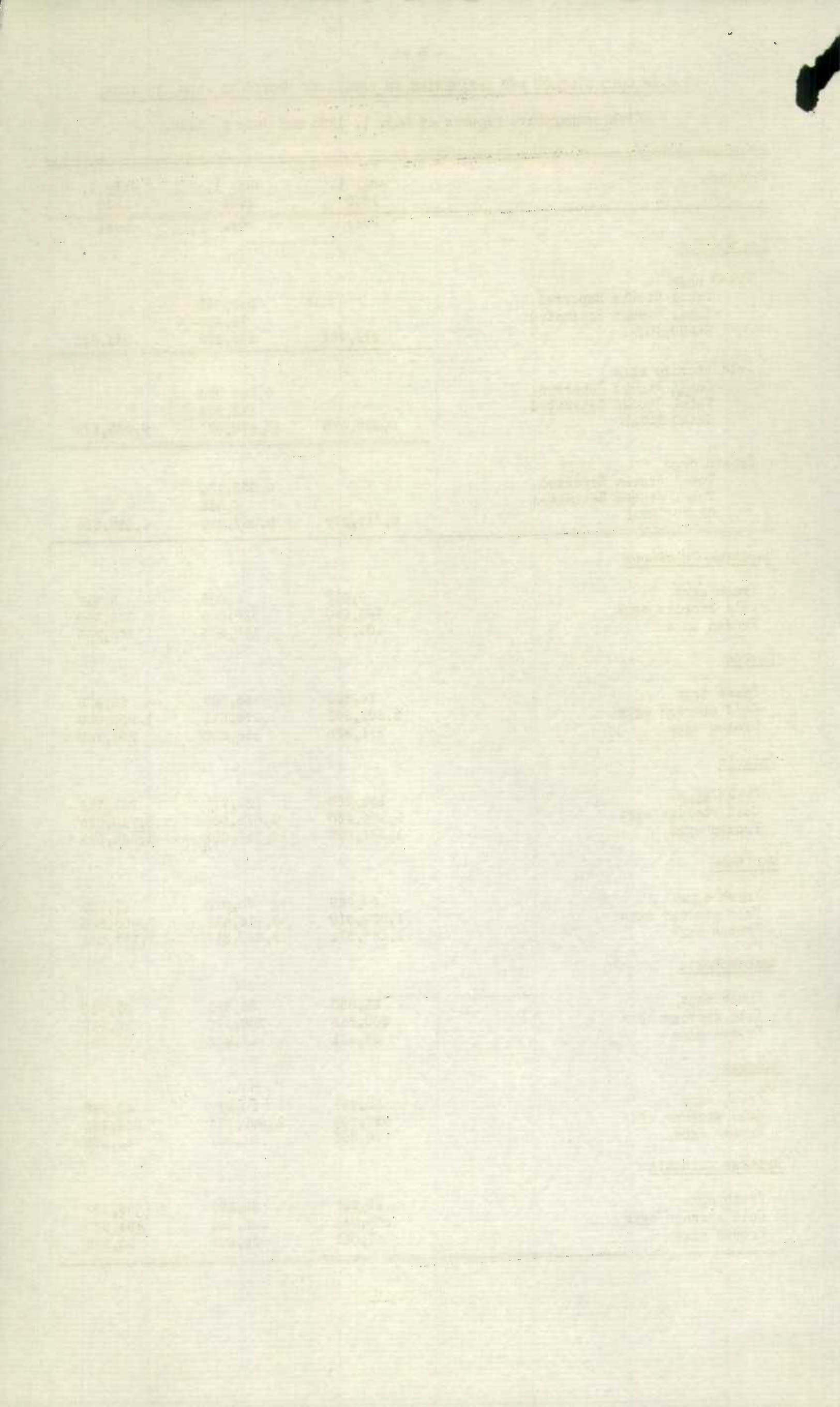
