

PRODUCTION OF BUTTER AND CHEESE

The production of creamery butter in Canada during the month of August, 1936 amounted to 31,506,239 pounds, compared with 32,946,849 pounds in August, 1935, representing a decrease of 1.4 million pounds or 4.4 per cent. The cumulative production for the seven months ending in August amounted to 172,712,745 pounds as compared with 167,385,067 pounds during the same period of 1935, an increase of 5.3 million pounds or 3.2 per cent.

The cheese production of Canada in the month of August, 1936 reached a total of 18,585,275 pounds. In the four provinces, Quebec, Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia for which comparative data are available for the same month of 1935, an increase of nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ million pounds or 2.5 per cent is recorded. The cumulative production from January 1, to August 31, 1936 in the four provinces mentioned, amounted to 72,619,513 pounds, compared with 63,025,990 pounds in the corresponding period of the previous year, which represents an increase of 9.5 million pounds or 15.2 per cent.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Creamery butter reported in cold storage warehouses and creameries at September 1, 1936 amounted to 50,206,562 pounds. Making an estimate for the holdings of firms that failed to report, this figure is increased by \$04,078 pounds, making a grand total of 50,910,640 pounds. Of this amount 35,830,459 pounds were held in cold storage warehouses and 15,080,181 pounds in creameries. Estimated stocks shown in the Canada totals are not included in the figures given by provinces. Comparing the grand total as shown at September 1, 1936 with stocks reported at the same date in the previous year, a decrease of 1.7 million pounds or 3.3 per cent is shown, and compared with the holdings at the first of the previous month an increase of approximately 9½ million pounds is recorded. The holdings of new firms added to the list since October 1, 1935 were approximately 627,000 pounds. Stocks of butter in the custody of railways at terminals and in transit, which are separately reported in this statement, amounted to 464,800 pounds.


Dairy butter stocks at September 1, 1936 amounted to 312,728 pounds as compared with 803,431 pounds at September 1, 1935 and 294,354 pounds at August 1, 1936.

Stocks of cheese reported in cold storages and dairy factories at September 1, 1936 amounted to 33,369,476 pounds. Adding 565,189 pounds for outstanding firms, there is shown a grand total of 33,934,665 pounds. Compared with the same date last year these stocks represent a decrease of approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ million pounds or 1.6 per cent and with the previous month, an increase of 4.2 million pounds or 14.1 per cont.

The reported holdings of cold storage eggs on September 1, 1936 were 10,360,-173 dozens, which, with estimated stocks of 75,020 dozens, gives a grand total of 10,435,193 dozens. These holdings represent intreases of approximately \$1,000 dozens or .8 per cent from September 1, 1935 and about 415 thousand dozens or 4.1 per cent compared with the stocks reported at the first of the previous month. Fresh eggs amounted to 589,611 dozens, which includes 6,511 dozens of estimated stocks. Comparing the grand total of 589,611 pounds with those reported at the same date of the previous year, an increase of 150 thousand dozens or 34.1 per cent is recorded, and with the previous month an increase of 207 thousand dozens or 54.3 per cent. Frozen stocks as reported at September 1, 1936 amounted to 5,208,375 pounds, and these together with the estimated stocks of 1,457 pounds gives a grand total of 5,209,832 pounds. These holdings represent increases of nearly 1 million pounds or 22.9 per cent over the stocks in store at September 1, 1935 and about 115 thousand pounds or 2.3 per cent over the stocks reported at the first of the previous month. Unclassified stocks of eggs in transit amounted to 132,570 pounds.

Concentrated whole milk products amounted to 14,158,988 pounds on September 1, 1936, a decrease of nearly 1 million pounds or 3.2 per cent less than was reported at the same date in 1935, and an increase of 169 thousand pounds or 1.2 per cent over the quantities reported at the first of the previous month. Stocks of concentrated milk byproducts were reported at 2,277,396 pounds on September 1,1936 representing a decrease of about 11 million pounds or 42.2 per cent from the same date as the previous year, and a decrease of 31 thousand pounds or 1.4 per cent from August 1, 1936.

Stocks of poultry as reported at September 1, 1936 reached a total of 3,661,-374 pounds. The addition of the estimated holdings of 63,641 pounds, produces a grand total of 3,725,015 pounds. When this figure is compared with the stocks reported at September 1, 1935, an increase of approximately 1½ million pounds or 66.9 per cent is revealed. Comparisons made with holdings at August 1, 1936, however, show a decrease of approximately ½ million pounds or 11.6 per cent. Transit stocks amounted to 25,000 pounds, all of which was consigned for export.





CREAMERY BUTTER STOCKS IN COLD STORAGES AND CREAMERIES IN CANADA, BY PROVINCES,


