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PRODUCTION OF BUTTER AND CHEESE

The production of creamery butter in Canada during the month of December, 1936 amounted to 10,806,926 pounds, an increase of approximately 410 thousand pounds or 3.9 per cent over that of the same month of the previous year. The cumulative production for the twelve months ending December, amounted to 250,292,677 pounds. Compared with the yearly production for 1935 it represents an increase of approximately 9.4 million pounds or 3.9 per cent.

Cheese production in Canada for the month of December, 1936 reached a total of 1,482,190 pounds. In the four provinces, Quebec, Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia for which comparative data are available for the same month of 1935, an increase of approximately 70 thousand pounds or 5.1 per cent is recorded. The cumulative production for the twelve months amounted to 117,769,341 pounds. Making comparisons with the same period of last year on the basis of returns from the four provinces already mentioned, an increase of approximately 17.4 million pounds or 17.8 per cent is indicated.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Creamery butter reported in cold storage warehouses and creameries at January 1, 1937, amounted to 34,652,919 pounds. Making an estimate to cover the holdings of firms that failed to report, this figure is increased by 1,294,860 pounds, giving a grand total of 35,947,779 pounds. Of this amount 25,748,170 pounds were held in cold storage warehouses and 10,199,609 pounds in creameries. Estimated stocks as shown in the Canada totals are not included in the figures by provinces. Comparing the grand total as at January 1, 1937 with stocks reported at the same date of the previous year, an increase of approximately 3.9 million pounds or 12 per cent is shown, and compared with the holdings at the first of the previous month there was a decrease of 8.6 million or 19.4 per cent. The holdings of new firms added to the list since February 1, 1936, amounted to approximately 337 thousand pounds. Stocks of butter in the custody of railways and at terminals and in transit, which are separately reported in this statement, amounted to 672,000 pounds as compared with 308,000 pounds a year ago.

Dairy butter stocks as reported at January 1, 1937 amounted to 159,454 pounds, which with the addition of 435 pounds to cover the estimate for outstanding firms, gives a grand total of 159,889 pounds. Compared with the figures given for January 1, 1936, these stocks represent a decrease of 61 thousand pounds or 27.6 per cent, and in comparison with the corresponding figure for the previous month, a decrease of approximately 70 thousand pounds or 30.5 per cent.

Stocks of cheese reported in cold storages and dairy factories at January 1, 1937 amounted to 24,337,142 pounds. With the addition of 567,294 pounds to cover the outstanding firms this shows a grand total of 24,904,436 pounds. Compared with the same date last year these stocks represent an increase of nearly 342 thousand pounds or 1.4 per cent, and with the previous month an increase of 2 million pounds or 8.9 per cent. Stocks contributed by new firms added to the list since February 1, 1936 amounted to approximately 2,900 thousand pounds.

The reported holdings of cold storage eggs at January 1, 1937 were 1,195,218 dozens, which with the estimated stocks of 9,899 dozens gives a grand total of 1,205,117 dozens. These holdings represent a decrease of approximately 95 thousand dozens or 7.3 per cent as compared with those reported at the same date last year, and a decrease of 2 million dozens or 63.4 per cent in comparison with the stocks reported at the first of the previous month. Fresh eggs amounted to 454,607 dozens which includes 33,020 dozens of estimated stocks. Comparing these stocks with those reported at the same date of the previous year, an increase of 122 thousand dozens or 36.7 per cent is recorded and with the previous month an increase of approximately 244 thousand dozens. Frozen eggs reported at January 1, 1937 amounted to 3,508,192 pounds. Including an estimate of 2,455 pounds, a grand total of 3,510,647 pounds is shown, which represents an increase of nearly 988 thousand pounds or 39.1 per cent over the stocks in store at January 1, 1936 and a decrease of approximately 426 thousand pounds or 10.8 per cent as compared with those reported at the first of the previous month. Unclassified stocks of eggs in transit amounted to 44,190 dozens compared with 44,190 dozens a year ago.

Concentrated whole milk products amounted to 10,510,401 pounds on January 1, 1937. In comparing the quantities reported at the same date in 1936, there was an increase of approximately 96 thousand pounds or nearly 1 per cent and compared with the holdings of the previous month, an increase of approximately 195 thousand pounds or nearly 2 per cent. Stocks of concentrated milk by-products were reported as 1,503,645 pounds, representing a decrease of approximately 1 million pounds or 41 per cent from that of January 1, 1936 and approximately 475 thousand pounds or 24 per cent below the holdings reported at December 1, 1936.

Stocks of poultry including estimated holdings of 401,566 pounds amounted to 15,317,938 pounds representing gains over the previous year and the previous month of 3.2 million pounds and 6.4 million pounds respectively. Transit stocks were 72,000 pounds as against 66,000 pounds a year ago. Of this amount 50,000 pounds were consigned for export.

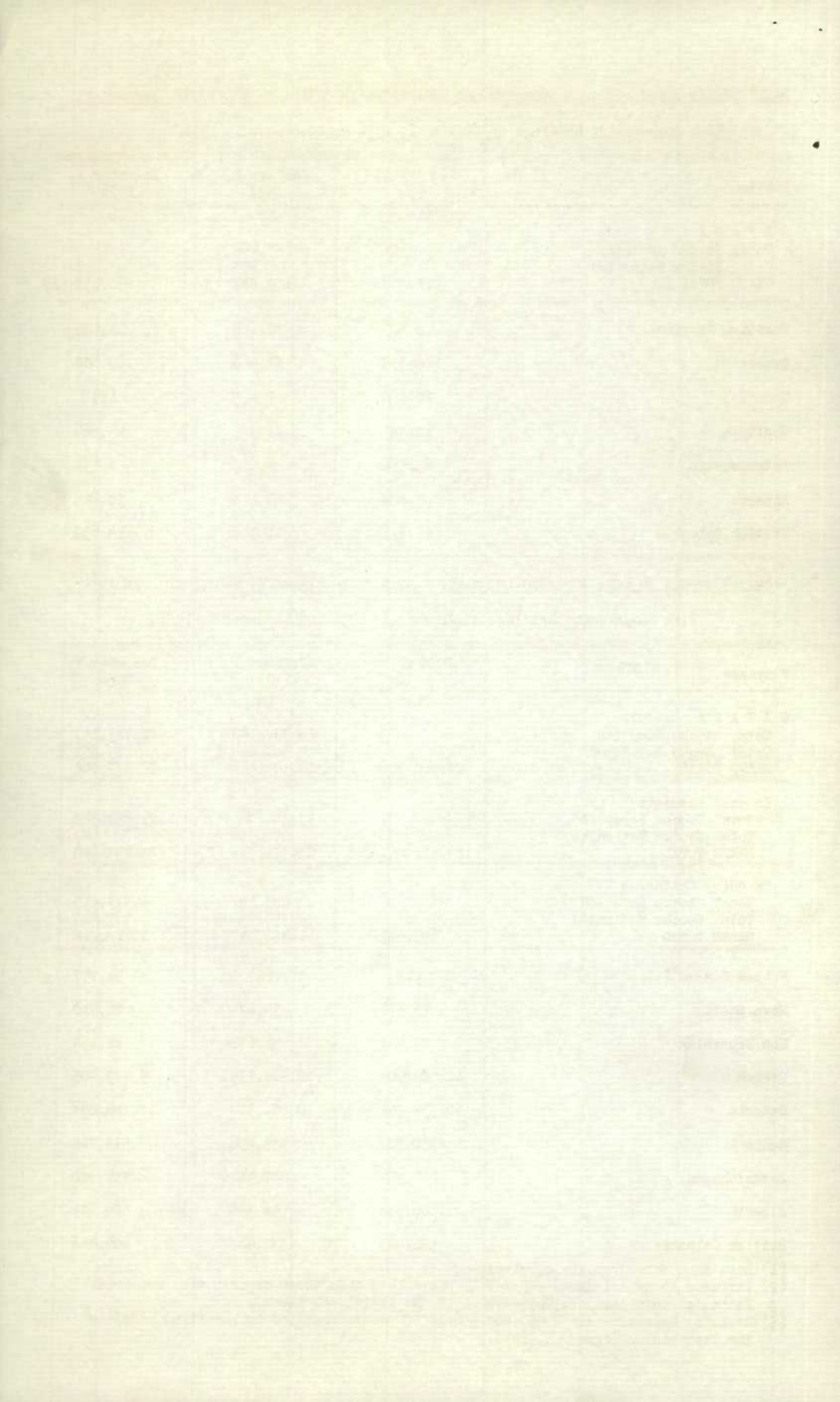
