



STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

CREAMERY BUTTER. The grand total of creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on November 1, 1937, amounted to 47,724,662 lb., consisting of 47,089,502 lb. actually reported and 635,160 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total 32,785,937 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 14,938,725 lb. in dairy factories. Estimated stocks are shown separately for Canada and for the provinces. A comparison of the grand total with stocks reported as of the same date last year shows a decrease of about 5.4 million lb. or 10.2 per cent; while a similar comparison with last month's revised report shows a decrease of 6.5 million lb. or 12.0 per cent.

Stocks held by new firms, added to the list since February 1, 1937, amounted to approximately 42 thousand 1b.

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals, reported by the railway companies, amounted to 940,800 lb. as compared with 476,000 lb. a year ago and 1,030,400 lb. last month.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1937 amounted to 348,343 lb. In comparison with the stocks at November 1, 1936, there is an increase this year of 36 thousand lb. being 11.5 per cent and compared with last month there is a decrease of 15 thousand lb. or 4.2 per cent.

CHEESE Warehouses and dairy factories reported 35,801,832 lb. of cheese. Adding 785,983 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 36,587,815 lb. is shown. These figures represent an increase of approximately 3.5 million lb. or 10.7 per cent over last year, and a decrease of 6.2 million lb. or 14.4 per cent from last month.

New firms added to the list since February 1, 1937, contributed approximately 2.25 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 13,344,504 lb. At the same date last year the quantities reported were 11,757,524 lb. This month's figure is approximately 1.6 million lb. or 13.5 per cent more than on November 1, 1936 and about 2.3 million lb. or 14.7 per cent less than at October 1, 1937.

By-Products amounted to 2,102,724 lb. as compared with 2,111,031 lb. for the same month in 1936, being a decrease of 8,307 lb. or 0.4 per cent, while compared with last month there is a decrease of 671,019 lb. or 24.2 per cent.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs are reported to a total of 6,041,568 dozens, representing a decrease of 927,380 dozens or 13.3 per cent from last year and a decrease of 3,322,011 dozens or 35.5 per cent from last month.

Fresh eggs reported amount to 263,748 dozens, being 82,618 dozens or 45.6 per cent more than last year, and 265,752 dozens or 50.2 per cent less than last month.

Eggs in transit in carloads amounted to 103,110 dozens as compared with 117,840 dozens last year and 44,190 dozens last month.

Frozen eggs amounted to 4,441,492 lb. This amount is 27,201 lb. or 0.6 per cent more than last year and 664,996 lb. or 13.0 per cent less than at October 1, 1937.

DRESSED POULTRY. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,057,404 lb.; fowl to 1,553,447 lb. and turkeys to 715,686 lb. Total stocks of all poultry amounted to 3,794,619 lb. being a decrease of 1.6 million lb. or 29.5 per cent from the figures of November 1, 1936 and an increase approximately 441 thousand lb. or 13.1 per cent over October 1, 1937 figures.

Poultry in transit amounted to 110,000 lb. as compared with 157,000 lb. at the same date last year and 66,000 lb. last month.
