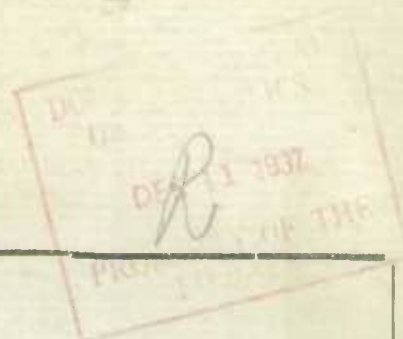

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

CREAMERY BUTTER. The grand total of creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on December 1, 1937, amounted to 37,891,873 lb., consisting of 37,350,068 lb. actually reported and 541,605 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total, 25,601,619 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 12,290,054 lb. in dairy factories. A comparison of the grand total with stocks reported as of the same date last year shows a decrease of about 6.5 million lb. or 14.6 per cent; while a similar comparison with last month's revised report shows a decrease of 9.8 million lb. or 20.6 per cent.

Stocks held by new firms, added to the list since February 1, 1937, amounted to approximately 40 thousand lb.

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals, reported by the railway companies, amounted to 252,000 lb. as compared with 212,800 lb. a year ago and 940,800 lb. last month.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at December 1, 1937 amounted to 176,021 lb. In comparison with the stocks at December 1, 1936, there is a decrease this year of 54 thousand lb. being 23.5 per cent and compared with last month there is a decrease of 172 thousand lb. or 49.5 per cent.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 28,512,408 lb. of cheese. Adding 400,369 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 28,912,777 lb. is shown. These figures represent an increase of approximately 6.1 million lb. or 27.0 per cent over last year, and a decrease of 7.7 million lb. or 21.0 per cent from last month.

New firms added to the list since February 1, 1937, contributed approximately 2.33 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 9,750,621 lb. At the same date last year the quantities reported were 10,375,692 lb. This month's figure is approximately 0.6 million lb. or 6.0 per cent less than on December 1, 1936 and about 3.7 million lb. or 27.3 per cent less than at November 1, 1937.

By-Products amounted to 1,561,591 lb. as compared with 1,978,603 lb. for the same month in 1936, being a decrease of 417,012 lb. or 21.1 per cent, while compared with last month there is a decrease of 864,251 lb. or 35.6 per cent.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs are reported to a total of 2,957,710 dozens, representing a decrease of 339,367 dozens or 10.3 per cent from last year and a decrease of 3,090,025 dozens or 51.1 per cent from last month.

Fresh eggs reported amount to 400,869 dozens, being 208,652 dozens or 108.6 per cent more than last year, and 132,326 dozens or 49.3 per cent more than last month.

Frozen eggs amounted to 3,980,994 lb. This amount is 44,588 lb. or 1.1 per cent more than last year and 460,498 lb. or 10.4 per cent less than at November 1, 1937.

DRESSED POULTRY. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,273,052 lb.; fowl to 1,805,374 lb. and turkeys to 1,303,387 lb. Total stocks of all poultry amounted to 6,142,787 lb. being a decrease of 2.7 million lb. or 30.8 per cent from the figures of December 1, 1936 and an increase of approximately 2.4 million lb. or 62.1 per cent over November 1, 1937 figures.

Poultry in transit amounted to 267,000 lb. as compared with 432,000 lb. at the same date last year and 110,000 lb. last month.
