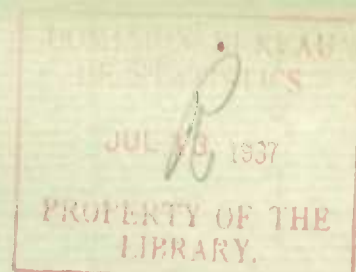

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Creamery Butter. The grand total of creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on July 2, 1937, (July 1 being a holiday) amounted to 26,414,113 lb., consisting of 25,660,692 lb. actually reported and 753,420 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total 16,848,544 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 9,565,568 lb. in dairy factories. Estimated stocks are shown separately for Canada and for the provinces. A comparison of the grand total with stocks reported as of the same date last year shows a decrease of about 1.5 million lb. or 5.5 per cent; while a similar comparison of last month's revised report shows an increase of nearly 17.3 million lb. or 189.7 per cent.

Stocks held by new firms, added to the list since February 1, 1937, amounted to approximately 57 thousand lb. Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals, reported by the railway companies, amounted to 588,000 lb. as compared with 728,000 lb. a year ago and 728,000 lb. last month.

Dairy Butter. The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 2, 1937 amounted to 47,596 lb. In comparison with the stocks at July 2, 1936, there is a decrease this year of 166 thousand lb. being 77.3 per cent and compared with last month there is an increase of 2 thousand lb. or 5.0 per cent.

Cheese. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 28,558,864 lb. of cheese. Adding 851,543 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 29,410,407 lb. is shown. These figures represent an increase of approximately 5 million lb. or 20.7 per cent over last year, and an increase of 10.2 million lb. or 53.3 per cent over last month.

New firms, added to the list since February 1, 1937, contributed approximately 2 million lb.

Concentrated Milk Products. Whole Milk products amounted to 13,158,154 lb. At the same date last year the quantities reported were 11,597,725 lb. This month's figure is approximately 1.6 million lb. or 13.5 per cent more than on July 2, 1936 and about 5.6 million lb. or 75.1 per cent over June 1, 1937.

By-products amounted to 1,723,346 lb. as compared with 2,465,938 lb. for the same month in 1936, being a decrease of 742,592 lb. or 30.1 per cent, while compared with last month there is an increase of 393,482 lb. or 29.6 per cent.

Eggs. Cold Storage eggs are reported to a total of 10,663,312 dozens. Adding 24,794 dozens for the estimate to cover outstanding firms, there is a grand total of cold storage eggs of 10,688,106 dozens, represent an increase of 735,705 dozens or 7.3 per cent over last year and an increase of 2,459,500 dozens or 29.9 per cent over last month.

Fresh eggs reported amounted to 698,432 dozens. This, together with the estimate of 3,541 dozens, amounts to a grand total of 701,973 dozens, being 154,580 dozens or 28.2 per cent greater than last year, and 140,840 dozens or 16.7 per cent less than last month.

Eggs in transit in carloads amounted to 176,760 dozens as compared with 147,300 dozens last year and 88,380 dozens last month.

Frozen eggs amounted to 5,697,278 lb. This amount is 1,479,774 lb. or 35.1 per cent more than last year and 1,521,730 lb. or 36.4 per cent more than June 1, 1937.

Dressed Poultry Chickens in stock amounted to 1,265,185 lb; fowl to 1,389,114 lb. and turkeys to 2,639,259 lb. Total stocks of all poultry amounted to 5,939,336 lb. being an increase of 1.3 million lb. or 28.3 per cent over the figures of July 2, 1936 and approximately 1 million lb. or 13.7 per cent under June 1, 1937 figures.
