

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

CREAMERY BUTTERY. The grand total of creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on January 1, 1938, amounted to 27,500,430 lb., consisting of 26,949,312 lb. actually reported and 551,118 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total, 18,201,194 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 9,299,236 lb. in dairy factories. A comparison of the grand total with stocks reported as of the same date last year shows a decrease of about 8.2 million lb. or 23.0 per cent; while a similar comparison with last month's revised report shows a decrease of 10.5 million lb. or 27.7 per cent.

Stocks held by <u>new firms</u>, added to the list since February 1, 1937, amounted to approximately 27 thousand 1b.

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals, reported by the railway companies, amounted to 588,000 lb. as compared with 672,000 lb. a year ago and 252,000 lb. last month.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1938 amounted to 137,725 lb. In comparison with the stocks at January 1, 1937, there is a decrease this year of 153 thousand lb. being 52.8 per cent and compared with last month there is a decrease of 39 thousand lb. or 22.2 per cent.

CHEESE. Marchouses and dairy factories reported 26,590,549 lb. of cheese. Adding 197,754 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 26,788,303 lb. is shown. These figures represent an increase of approximately 2.7 million lb. or 11.4 per cent over last year, and a decrease of 0.9 million lb. or 3.3 per cent from last month.

New firms added to the list since February 1, 1937, contributed approximately 2.4 million 1b.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 9,101,241 lb. At the same date last year the quantities reported were 10,536,370 lb. This month's figure is approximately 1.4 million lb. or 13.6 per cent less than on January 1, 1937 and about 0.6 million lb. or 6.7 per cent less than at December 1, 1937.

By-Products amounted to 1,162,471 lb. as compared with 1,660,019 lb. for the same month in 1937, being a decrease of 497,548 lb. or 30.0 per cent, while compared with last month there is a decrease of 438,305 lb. or 27.4 per cent.


EGGS. Cold Storage eggs are reported to a total of 1,336,359 dozens, representing an increase of 84,419 dozens or 6.7 per cent from last year and a decrease of 1,624,204 dozens or 54.9 per cent from last month.

Fresh eggs reported amount to 432,066 dozens, being 8,970 dozens or 2.0 per cent less than last year, and 30,887 dozens or 7.7 per cent more than last month.

<u>Frozen</u> eggs amounted to 3,425,351 lb. This amount is 83,471 lb. or 2.4 per cent less than last year and 591,603 lb. or 14.7 per cent less than at December 1, 1937.

DRESSED POULTRY. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,869,256 lb.; fowl to 1,959,646 lb., and turkeys to 3,958,452 lb. Total stocks of all poultry amounted to 10,361,754 lb., being a decrease of 6.5 million lb. or 38.4 per cent from the figures of January 1, 1937, and an increase of approximately 4.2 million lb. or 68.7 per cent over December 1, 1937 figures.

Poultry in transit amounted to 88,000 lb. as compared with 72,000 lb. at the same date last year and 267,000 lb. last month.




