

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FOULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1938.

CREAMERY BUTTER. The grand total of Canadian creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on May 1, 1938, amounted to 4,571,910 lb., consisting of 4,342,993 lb. actually reported and 228,917 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total, 1,459,543 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 3,112,367 lb. in dairy factories.

The Grand Total stocks are 21.4 per cent less than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of April, 1938 was 135 thousand 1b. as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.3 million lb. for April 1937.

In addition to the above, however, it is to be noted that approximately 408,500 lb. of imported creamery butter (not "In Bond") was on hand on May 1,1938, and there was also approximately 57,000 lb. "In Bond".

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals, reported by the railway companies, amounted to 140,000 1b.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1938 amounted to 9,391 lb., which is a decrease of 78.5 per cent from last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 17,382,239 lb. of cheese. Adding 175,332 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 17,557.571 lb. is shown. Firms added to our list, as of January 1, 1938, contributed approximately 950 thousand 1b.

These figures represent an increase of 1.6 million 1b. over last year and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.7 million lb., which is 1.7 million lb. more than the same movement for April 1937.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 11,244,802 lb. of which Evaporated Whole Milk was 10,145,467 lb.

By-Products totalled 2,426,141 lb. Included in this amount are 1,634,975 lb. of Skim Milk Powder.

EGGS.

Cold Storage eggs are reported to a total of 3,710,362 dozens.

Fresh eggs amounted to a total of 704,928 dozens.

Total Shell eggs show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 3.3 million dozens during the month as compared with a similar movement of 3.4 million dozens a year ago.

Shell eggs in transit at May 1, 1938, amounted to 58,920 dozens.

Frozen eggs amounted to 2,838,002 lb., the net "Into-Storage" movement being 599 thousand lb. as compared with 348 thousand lb. last year.

DRESSED POULTRY. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,498,160; fowl to 463,590 lb., and turkeys to 2,814,309 lb. Total stocks of all poultry amounted to 4,940,820 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement is 1.3 million 1b. as compared with 2.6 million lb. in April 1937.
